



The Israelites knew when the Passover was coming, and so were not in fear, but had faith and courage, "putting into effect with one accord the divine institution." In this we can see a foretelling of the Eucharist that we celebrate according to Christ's command, "Do this in memory of me."

We see that Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, and Jacob died in faith, although they did not see fulfillment of the promise. We live in hope that our faith will be fulfilled every time we celebrate this sacrament. We too are not to be afraid, but to have hope that our faith will be fulfilled in the coming of Christ.


TODAY'S READINGS

Saints of the Week

Monday, August 12th: Saint Jane Frances de Chantal,


Religious; died 13 December 1641 at age 69 ; from Dijon; wife of Baron de Chantal and mother of six children, two of whom died at birth; as a widow, with St. Francis de Sales, her spiritual director, she founded in 1610 at Annency in Savoy the Visitation nuns; established some eighty-

five monasteries before her death.

Tuesday, August 13th: (1)Saint Pontian, Pope and Martyr; died 235; bishop of Rome banished by Maximinius Thrax to Sardinia where he reconciled with Hippolytus; before dying, he abdicated his office (first pope to do so) to make way for his successor, St. Anterus (3 Jan.); buried in the cemetery of Callistus.

(2)Saint Hippolytus, Priest and Martyr; died 235/236 at age 65; disputed author of the *Apostolic Tradition*; Roman priest and stern rigorist; opposed Sabellianism and milder penitential discipline of Pope St. Callistus (14 Oct.); first anti-pope (217-235); exiled to Sardinia with Pontian; source of Eucharistic Prayer II.

Wednesday, August 14th: Saint Maximilian Kolbe,



Priest, Martyr; died 1941 at age 47 at Auschwitz by lethal injection; born near Lodz, Poland; founded Militia of Mary Immaculate; missioned in Japan; offered his life in exchange for the father of a family.

Thursday, August 15th: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary; the Natale or Dormitio ("Falling-asleep") of Mary came to be celebrated as early as the 5th century in the East and in Rome; patroness of France, Paraguay, Jamaica, South Africa, and New Caledonia.

Friday, August 16th: Saint Stephen of Hungary; died



1038 at age 61; as the first Christian king of Hungary he united and Christianized the Magyar people; received the "holy crown" from Pope Sylvester II in 1000; renowned for his charity to beggars; known as the "Apostolic King and Apostle of Hungary".


LECTURAS DE HOY
