




Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

USING OUR TIME WISELY

A jar of honey lasts practically forever. The oldest jar of honey ever discovered was over five thousand years old. Honey is quite different from market-fresh produce, then; because most fruits and vegetables last only a few days, we treat them carefully. At this time of summer, we rush to find recipes for cherries and cucumbers so we won't waste a single one. We wouldn't feel that same urgency about honey.

In our own way, we are as delightful and fragile as ripe produce. Today's readings urge us not to spoil, but to make good use of our limited time on earth. Ecclesiastes reminds us that because God provides for us now and always, we can manage our daily affairs without anxiety. Saint Paul encourages the Colossians to keep thoughts of heaven in everything they do, and Jesus himself asks us to treasure not earthly wealth, but God alone.

UNITED IN CELEBRATION: FAITHFUL COMMEMORATE SECOND ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEDICATION OF HOLY NAME OF JESUS CATHEDRAL

On July 26th, the Diocese of Raleigh celebrated the second anniversary of the dedication of Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral. Monsignor David Brockman, rector of Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral, was principal celebrant for the Mass, and Monsignor Gerald Lewis served as homilist.

"This evening we are gathered in the house of the Lord; this house built by faithful and generous people from every parish in the Diocese of Raleigh," Monsignor Lewis said. "This house of the Lord is as much the cathedral of Kitty Hawk, or Southport, or Ahoskie, or Rocky Mount, of Burlington or Siler. Yes, it is the cathedral for Raleigh, and it is the home for all." He described how that kind of unity, the kind that is represented by a cathedral, is the kind of unity we need in our world today. The theme of unity played strongly throughout the Mass.

THE LEGEND OF ST. LAWRENCE

St. Lawrence lived during the persecution of Emperor Valerian in 258. According to the legend, he worked as one of seven deacons, under Pope Sixtus II. His responsibilities included managing the Church's material goods, as well as the giving of alms to the poor.

In that capacity, Lawrence sold some of the Church's possessions and distributed the money to the poor.

When Valerian heard this, he decided that the pope and the Christians must be extremely wealthy. So he demanded Lawrence bring him the Church's treasures instead.

Knowing that his days as a free man were probably limited, the deacon replied that the Church indeed was wealthy and asked for time to inventory and present the Church's great wealth. Valerian agreed.

For the next three days, Lawrence gathered together the poor, the widows and orphans, and the sick of Rome. He then presented them to Valerian, declaring, "These are the riches of the Church."

The angry emperor ordered Lawrence to be killed.

The feast of St. Lawrence, deacon and martyr, is celebrated August 10.



Saints of the Week

Monday, August 5th: The Dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary Major; following the declaration of Mary as Teotokos (“God-bearer”) by the Council of Ephesus in 431, Pope Sixtus III erected in Rome this oldest basilica in the West dedicated to the Mother of God.


Wednesday, August 7th: Saint Sixtus II, Pope, and Companions, Martyrs; were arrested on 6 Aug. 258 while celebrating the Eucharist in the cemetery of Callistus; by order of Valerian, they were decapitated that same day.

Thursday, August 8th: Saint Dominic, Priest; died 6 August 1221 at age 51; born in Caleruega, Spain; founded the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans), today numbering some 6,550 religious; an elective, fraternal form of community life devoted to contemplation, study, and preaching; sought to bring Albigensians back into the Church through preaching and living evangelical poverty; canonized in 1234.

Friday, August 9th: Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Virgin, Martyr; was born with the name Edith Stein in Breslau, Germany (now Wroclaw, Poland) in 1891 of Jewish parents. Died at age 51. She studied philosophy under Husserl, the leading

phenomenologist of his day. Inspired by the writings of St. Teresa of Avila, she was baptized 1 January 1922. She taught in various schools from 1923-1933 until forced to resign due to anti-Semitic legislation. In 1933, she entered the Discalced Carmelite convent in Cologne where she received the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. At the end of 1939, she moved to the convent at Echt, Holland, on account of the Nazi persecution of Jews, but in 1942, during the German occupation of Holland, she was arrested, transported to Poland, and killed (9 August) at the Nazi concentration camp at Auschwitz. Along with St. Catherine of Siena (29 April) and St. Bridget of Sweden (23 July), she was declared copatroness of Europe by Pope John Paul II.

Saturday, August 10th: Saint Lawrence, Deacon, Martyr; died 258; four days after four other deacons and Pope Sixtus II were killed; cared for the temporal welfare of the Roman church; said to have been burned alive on a gridiron; after Sts. Peter and Paul, Lawrence is venerated as patron of Rome.

La Leyenda de San Lorenzo

San Lorenzo vivió durante la persecución del emperador Valeriano en 258. Según la leyenda, trabajó como uno de los siete diáconos, bajo el papa Sixto II. Sus responsabilidades incluían administrar los bienes materiales de la Iglesia, así como dar limosna a los pobres.

En esa capacidad, Lawrence vendió algunas de las posesiones de la Iglesia y distribuyó el dinero a los pobres.

Cuando Valeriano escuchó esto, decidió que el papa y los cristianos debían ser extremadamente ricos. Así que le exigió a Lorenzo que le trajera los tesoros de la Iglesia. Sabiendo que sus días como hombre libre probablemente eran limitados, el diácono respondió que la Iglesia sí era rica y le pidió tiempo para hacer un inventario y presentar la gran riqueza de la Iglesia. Valeriano estuvo de acuerdo. Durante los siguientes tres días, Lorenzo reunió a los pobres, las viudas y los huérfanos, y los enfermos de Roma. Luego los presentó a Valeriano, declarando: "Estas son las riquezas de la Iglesia".

El emperador enojado ordenó que mataran a Lorenzo. La fiesta de San Lorenzo, diácono y mártir, se celebra el 10 de agosto.


