





Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

GOD IS ON THE SIDE OF THE POOR

Two of today's readings make it quite clear that God is on the side of the poor. Amos describes in detail the exploitation of the poor and needy. The psalm repeats that God acts to benefit the poor and lowly. But Luke turns things upside down, telling a tale of a conflicted steward, about to be fired, who demonstrates his cleverness and is rewarded. Like the community to whom Paul writes in Timothy, these readings are personal, directed to believers, members of the Jewish and Christian communities, who struggle to deal with personal choices about how to conduct their lives. They offer an outline for how God wishes us to live in a world as complicated and as confusing as our own.

Dear Parishioners,

Our Faith Formation Program is underway. Catechists are beginning to formally teach as registration comes to a close.

Mass attendance has increased due to the start of classes. I would like to remind parishioners of a couple things regarding Church etiquette and Safe Environment. Please, come to Mass on time. Latecomers are reminded to wait to go to a pew until a reading that is being proclaimed is finished; this act shows respect for the Word of God and avoids distraction for those who are in the pews trying to hear the Word.

Please, do not chew gum in the Sanctuary. If you happen to forget, please, do not place it under the pew! Simply stand up and go to the atrium to discard the gum in the trash container.

Children should avoid trips to the restroom during Mass. To prevent this from occurring, parents should arrive earlier to give children the chance to visit the restroom. I emphatically suggest that parents go with children to the restroom. They may need you there and you want to make sure that they will be totally safe since we do not know who might be there. Each time I see an unaccompanied child leaving the Sanctuary during Mass I worry.

Let's keep these things in mind for a safe and orderly Church experience.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Although June is the month most associated with weddings in the United States, September has become more popular in recent years. Wedding celebrations always require some savvy planning, and people who have a talent for hospitality in the mix. At the wedding feast at Cana, the mother of Jesus was recruited to deal with some of the details of the banquet, and when a very understandable crisis arose, she did what she could to rescue the party. Anyone who has ever run out of ice, dessert, or table settings knows the stress!

Slowly, the memory of Jesus Christ's blessing of this marriage feast led the Church to form a way to bless marriages. A thousand years ago weddings migrated from the family home to the doors of the church, where the celebration was held in public view. From this practice came a prayer called the "Nuptial Blessing," one of the most solemn prayers in our tradition. It is very much like the prayers by which baptismal water and chrism are consecrated, the ordination prayer over a priest, and the Eucharistic Prayers over bread and wine. Four hundred fifty years ago, weddings moved inside the church building. All of this gives married couples good reason to celebrate their anniversaries well, especially with the clinking of glasses filled with good wine.

Saints of the Week

Monday, September 23rd: Saint Pius of Pietrelcina,

Priest; “Padre Pio” was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in the small Italian village of Pietrelcina and died at age 81. A Capuchin priest who had received the stigmata, he spent fifty years at the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, where he was much sought after as a spiritual advisor, confessor, and intercessor.

Despite such notoriety, he would often say, “I only want to be a poor friar who prays”. His life was devoted to the Eucharist and to prayer. He died 23 September 1968. He is considered the patron saint of civil defense volunteers and Catholic adolescents.

Thursday, Sept. 26th: Saints Cosmas and Damian, Martyrs; died 300 at Cyrrhus in Syria; brother physicians known as “moneyless ones” for their gratuitous care of the sick; patrons of physicians, surgeons, druggists, barbers, and the blind.

Friday, Sept. 27th: Saint Vincent de Paul, Priest; died

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL
1660 in Paris at age 79; born in Pouy; renewed the clergy and defended the poor and the abandoned; founded (1625) the Congregation of the Missions (Vincentians), today numbering some 3,830 members; mission preachers and seminary educators; with St. Louise de Marillac (15

March), founded the Daughters of Charity; preached against Jansenism; patron of charities, of hospitals and prisoners, and of Madagascar.

Saturday, Sept. 28th: (1)Saint Wenceslaus, Martyr; died 929 at age twenty-two; duke of Bohemia; sought to bring the faith to his people; killed by his pagan brother, Boleslaus; patron of the Czech Republic and Slovakia.

(2)Saint Lawrence Ruiz and Companions, Martyrs; today the Church commemorates sixteen martyrs (thirteen Dominicans and three Tertiaries) of Nagasaki, Japan, during the years 1633-1637; they included nine Japanese, four Spaniards, one Frenchman, an Italian, and the Philippino, Lawrence Ruiz, the father of a family and protomartyr of the Philippines; after enduring horrible tortures, their bodies were burned and their ashes scattered by order of the ruler, Tokugawa Yemitsu.



Ofrecen un bosquejo de cómo Dios desea que vivamos en un mundo tan complicado y tan confundido como el nuestro.

La asistencia a Misa ha aumentado debido al inicio de las clases. Me gustaría recordarles a los feligreses un par de cosas sobre la etiqueta en la Iglesia y el Ambiente Seguro. Por favor, lleguen a Misa a tiempo. Se les recuerda a los que llegan tarde a que esperen para ir a una banca hasta que termine una lectura que se proclama; este acto muestra respeto por la Palabra de Dios y evita la distracción de aquellos que están en las bancas tratando de escuchar la Palabra.

Por favor, no mastique chicle en el santuario. Si olvida, por favor, ¡no lo coloque debajo del la banca! Simplemente levántese y vaya al atrio para desechar la goma de mascar en el contenedor de basura.

Los niños deben evitar ir al baño durante la Misa. Para evitar que esto ocurra, los padres deben llegar antes para darles la oportunidad de visitar el baño. Sugiero enfáticamente que los padres vayan con los niños al baño. Es posible que los necesiten allí y usted quiera asegurarse de que están totalmente seguros, ya que no sabemos quién podría estar allí. Cada vez que veo a un niño no acompañado saliendo del Santuario durante la Misa, me preocupo.

Tengamos en cuenta estas cosas para una experiencia de la Iglesia segura y ordenada.
