# Matters arising form the AGM held 21 June 2024

#### a. Insurance

The Vice Chair of County has been trying to seek clarity from EN regarding the conditions of insurance since February. Currently, it appears that all insurance is void if unaffiliated players are participating in a game even with a qualified umpire. It was suggested that Howdens, the insurance brokers for EN, should be contacted direct to seek clarification. Action: Vice Chair

#### b. Accounts

Sheelagh Redpath stated there were approximately 1,872 total affiliations for Norfolk; comprising O18 – 1212, U18 – 339, U14 – 221 and U11 - 100. It was agreed that, if possible, a breakdown will be circulated post meeting. Action: Chair/Treasurer

Update: The Membership Secretary includes the membership figures in every committee meeting report. However there is still the issues of being to find the full breakdown between clubs and schools and whether all members have linked to their local league and also to Norfolk County (The latter has an implication on whether the County are receiving all the money they should - Membership Secretary still to action this).

#### c. Committee

Sarah Wagstaff suggested that BTec students could take up one or more of the roles on the committee as part of their course. The Chairperson agreed to investigate further and contact Jenny Day. Action: Chair

Update: No response was received from Jenny Day. Role now filled.

Gemma Ashton agreed to publish the roles and responsibilities of the vacant posts on various social platforms and to clubs. Action: Gemma Ashton

Update: Vacancies were published on social media platforms.

## d. Juniors

It was noted that Helen Rowe is trying to establish a junior club but a CAPS accreditation was required. It was unanimously agreed by all present that more junior clubs are needed; Thoroughbreds are inundated with enquiries. Action: Chairperson to ascertain what a CAPS accreditation is.

Update: CAPS is currently paused.

## e. Coaching

The level 2 coaching training course is a full day's session. Anne Harper to raise at the next East Region meeting to ascertain the reasoning. Action: Chair

Update: EN website states the course consists of three virtual sessions of three hours spread over three different dates. There are two days of face to face delivery and one virtual professional discussion on a different date, lasting for an hour.
