Thank you for your trust and confidence in my leadership. Let's make this a remarkable year for our association and the community we serve.

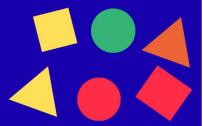

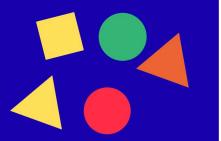
Reflections by Ram Gnanasekar, BSN, RN, CCRN

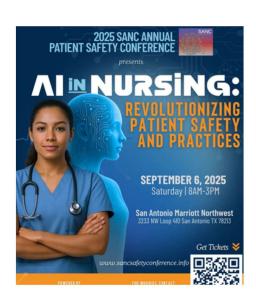


Education

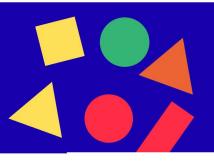

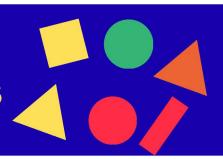

As the backbone of healthcare systems, nurses stand to benefit immensely from AI's integration, provided it's guided by ethical principles and human-centered design.

Transforming Clinical Practice

Al will fundamentally change how nurses assess, monitor, and respond to patient needs:

Predictive analytics will empower nurses to anticipate complications before they arise. For example, AI can detect early signs of sepsis or heart failure by analyzing subtle changes in vital signs and lab results.

Smart documentation tools using natural language processing will reduce time spent on charting, allowing nurses to focus more on direct patient care. Decision support systems will offer evidence-based recommendations, helping nurses make faster and more accurate clinical judgments. These innovations will enhance safety, reduce errors, and improve the precision of nursing interventions.

Nurses must lead the way, using empathy, leadership, and critical thinking to shape AI that truly supports patient-centered care. Let's build a future where AI empowers, not replaces nurses.

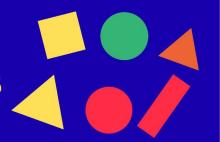

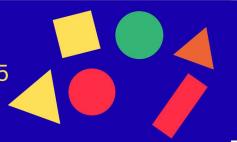

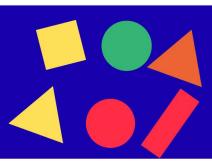
