bondage. Pharaoh is a type of the devil, the hard taskmaster. The Children of Israel represent the church and Moses and Joshua. The





Sin begins to show its ugly side after people are trapped, ensnared by its binding habits, and dependent upon its awful degrading fare for survival. So the children of Jacob found some satisfaction in Egypt at first, like the Bible says: there is pleasure in sin for a **season.** Then the awful consequences begin: it may be a broken home because of immorality, or an unwanted pregnancy for some unmarried girl or woman; maybe death comes as a result of our sinful ways, and then we are in hell forever. I can assure you that sin will be very **costly** if you continue in it. Like Jacob's family, Egypt started out treating them like royalty, but ended up treating them like slaves.

The slavery and the bondage grew **worse** and not better as they began to want to be free. The Jews simply existed. Their life was a daily drudgery of toil, labor, and bondage. All they worked for only benefited

Pharaoh. They did not get ahead nor better themselves under the hard whip of the slave drivers. The situation was now so severe that they could do nothing else but **submit** to the demands of Pharaoh and his guards. They could not deliver **themselves** from this bondage. This is the progression of **sin** in so many lives. The bondage gets more severe, the devil **robs** us of the fruits of our

than we were years ago,





and sick of spending our lives for that which does not bring any lasting satisfaction. Then they began to cry out to God for **deliverance** from this severe treatment.

I will show you why a little later in the message. Moses brings them to the Red Sea **experience**, which is a type of regeneration or salvation. It is the first crisis of the supernatural **experience**.

Abraham & his descendants years before. God keeps His **promises**, so we should never doubt His word.

This is the light of sanctification and the experience of holiness of **heart** and life. When God deals with us, wants us to trust Him and move up to the life of Holiness, we should never question His **ability** to do this work. These people were fearful, & failed to go into the rest of **sanctification**. They spent the next 40



At Kadesh, they cross the Jordan River at the time it is **overflowing** its banks. The people of God went over on dry ground into **Canaan**. This represents the second crisis in our **experience** which is known as sanctification. It took faith here, just as it did at the **Red Sea**. The waters did not stop until the priest's feet touched the waters. You have to believe God, and trust God, before the miracles of **grace** will begin in your life.

Pentecost was the 4th **feast**

of the Jewish 7 major **feasts**, also known as the Feast of **Weeks**. It began 50 days from the Feast of



Firstfruits. It was the beginning of the summer grain harvest and was celebrated much like the Feast of **Firstfruits**. Acts, chapter 2, begins on the Day of Pentecost which was a **Sunday**. The scene is Jerusalem, and the 120 believers have been engaged in a

Jerusalem, and the 120 believers have been engaged in a 10 day prayer meeting in the upper **room** awaiting the Promise of the Father which Jesus had commanded them to wait and tarry for.
