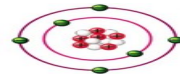
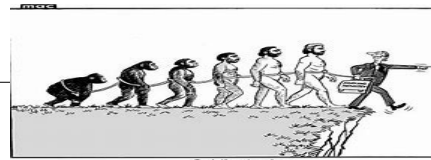

(P-4) Bible Critics-Words-Godhead

80-As most men give different meanings or shades of meanings to different words, the modern day Bible critic argues in his mind that God cannot perfectly speak to man, and, if he could, he could not preserve his Word. This erroneous reasoning means God could only perfectly speak to one man at a time. This justifies this Bible **critic** to think in his heart that it is God's fault that the critic cannot know exactly what God means. This is the basis of modern attacks on the Bible, as man does not want to obey God, but to be his own god & do as he wants. This is rebellious unbelief.

81-When the Bible says God rested, this does not mean he went to sleep and forgot all; or all things, including gravity, would have disappeared. Our resting God **sustains**, not doing or making added activities.

82-When God said that he made man in "our image," he was referring to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we call Trinity or Godhead (Acts 17:29) which the Bible calls the **Godhead**, meaning and being the same.

83-In creation God made **adult** animals and plants and commanded they reproduce after their seeds & kind.

84-Created man and animals could not have been babies, or God would have had to provide a **nursery** for Adam and Eve. God says he made big fish, and not babies or fish eggs. He made plants, not seeds.

85-Considering the continuous shining of the **sun**, how much diesel would be needed per hour to keep it shining? His creation is beyond our imaginations.

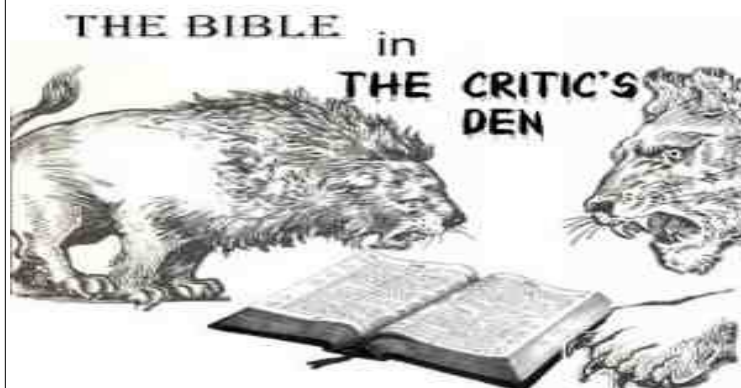
Among God's secrets and our ignorance, we may ask why man could sin. The answer is that God wanted a man who could make decisions; and considering all of God's attributes or characteristics, including holiness, love, justice, and knowing all, any disobedience had to be punished-meaning deaths of various kinds.

86-The only reason Adam and Eve did not immediately go to hell, as God said in the day of eating the forbidden, was that in the mind of God, Jesus had already been crucified. They did not die eternally nor physically, but only spiritually. Even God's words do not give every detail to man, but what man needs.

87-The whole Levitical system of sacrifices in the Old Testament, shown in Leviticus and explained in Hebrews, related to and pointed to Calvary and Christ's death and rising again. In this offering his blood was offered only **once** for all in the Holy of Holies of Heaven, as Hebrews 9 and 10 explain.

*The Holy of Holies was a 15 ft cube, represented God's presence, and was only entered once yearly.

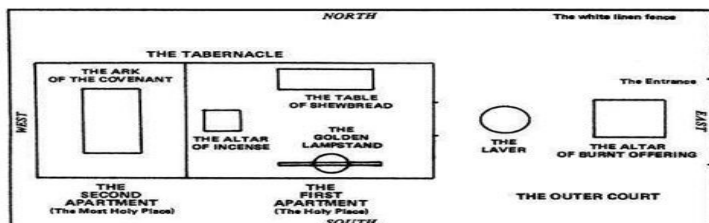

*The most delicate area or the inner part of the tabernacle was the Holy of Holies, where the ark of the covenant was located. It contained manna, Moses' rod that budded and the two tablets of the ten commandments. A priest could be killed by God if offending while there, so he wore bells on his clothes with a rope to pull him out if killed by God for offending.

*The ark size was $3\frac{1}{4}$ ft long by $2\frac{1}{4}$ wide—with the same height—wood—covered with gold. The Tabernacle layout is below: 1—to right altar 2—the laver 3—the Holy Place, the table, altar and lamp 4—The inside room is the Holy of Holies. The veil divided the large Holy Place and the half size Holy of Holies below:

*The veil that divided the Holy Place and the Holy of Holies was made of layers of expensive curtain materials. These kind were placed in Solomon & Herod's temple. When Christ was on the cross, this veil was ripped from top to bottom by God, showing our way into Heaven's Holy of Holies.

*The front entrance and first part was the Holy Place which had a candlestick of pure gold, and a table called table of shewbread.

*The fence around the tabernacle, or the court yard, was 150 feet long and 75 feet wide, or 50 by 25 yards, being half by $\frac{1}{4}$ th of a football field.

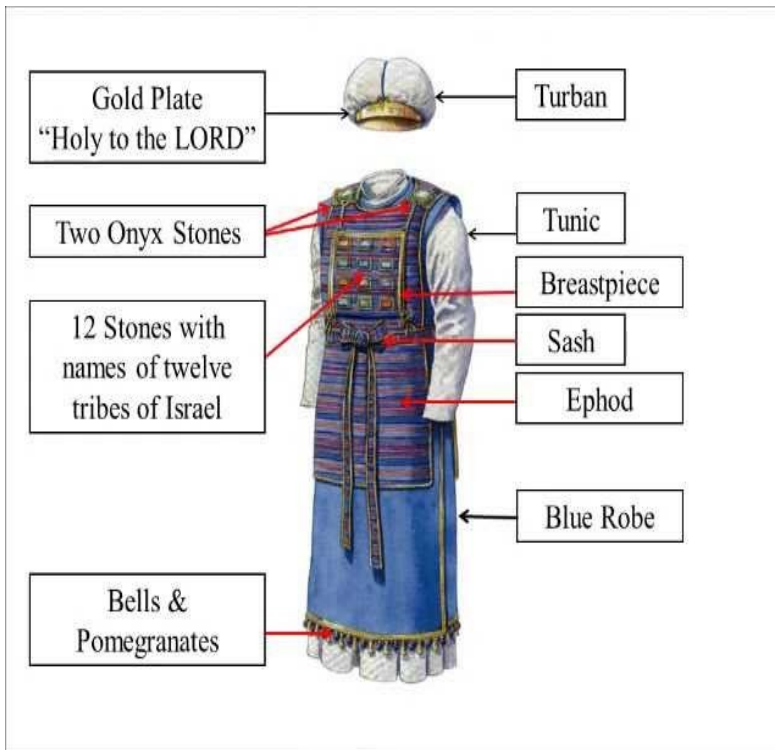

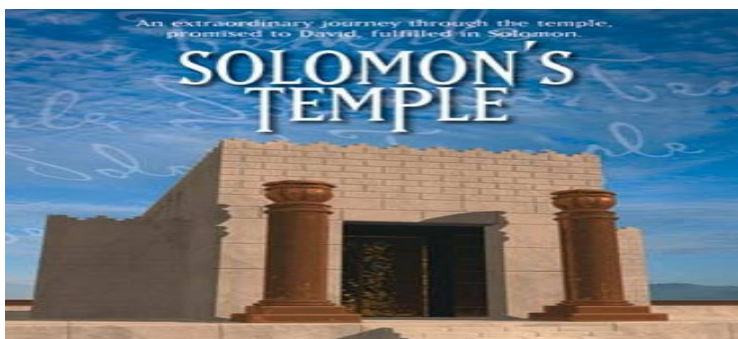

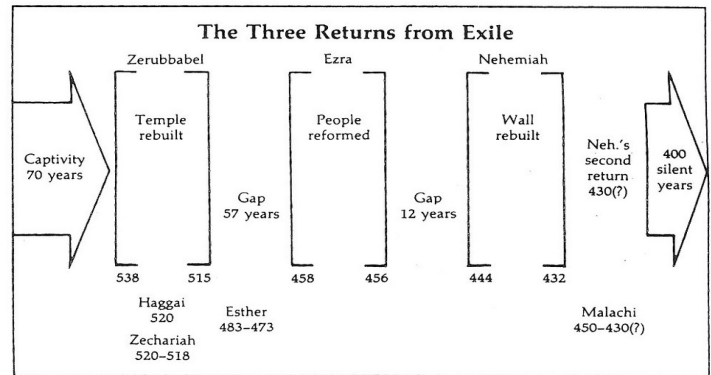

In the 13th year of King Josiah of Judah (627 B.C.), God called Jeremiah when he was still a youth, (verse 2). In fact, God had already set Jeremiah apart for the office of a prophet before he was even born, in order to take God's words to all Israel and to the nations (verse 5). "Behold, I have put My words in thy mouth. See, I have this day set thee over the nations and over the kingdoms, to root out and to pull down, and to destroy and to throw down, to build and to plant" (Jeremiah 1:9-10).

Jeremiah's life and times-Jeremiah served as one of God's prophets through the rule of five kings of Judah (Josiah,



Jehoahaz, Jehoiakim, Jehoiachin and Zedekiah). He even continued to plead God's case against Judah during the time of Jerusalem's destruction by the Babylonians in 586 B.C. (Jeremiah 1:3; 52:7-11).

43-How many kings was Jeremiah under? f _____

At the start of Jeremiah's prophetic ministry, Judah's King was only 21 years old. Josiah had begun to make major reforms in an effort to bring Judah back to proper religious observance (2 Chronicles 34:3). Five years later, the long-missing Book of the Law was discovered hidden in the temple in Jerusalem (2 Kings 22:3, 8). Jeremiah devoted himself to preaching "the words of this covenant" to the people in Jerusalem and throughout Judah (Jer 11:1-8).

Jeremiah's challenge-God called Jeremiah to his prophetic ministry about one year after King Josiah began leading the nation in a great reform from the widespread idolatry. (2 Kings 21:10, 20).

Josiah's reforms would not preserve Judah and Jerusalem from God's punishment because the sins of Manasseh had become so deeply embedded (Jeremiah 15:4). Judgment would now come.

It was written to announce judgment upon Judah, to allow them to repent, and foretells of the coming deliverance of God's nation from captivity in Babylon.

This includes not only the current nation of Israel, but also the future of the coming Messiah, the Temple, and the Kingdom of God in the End age. 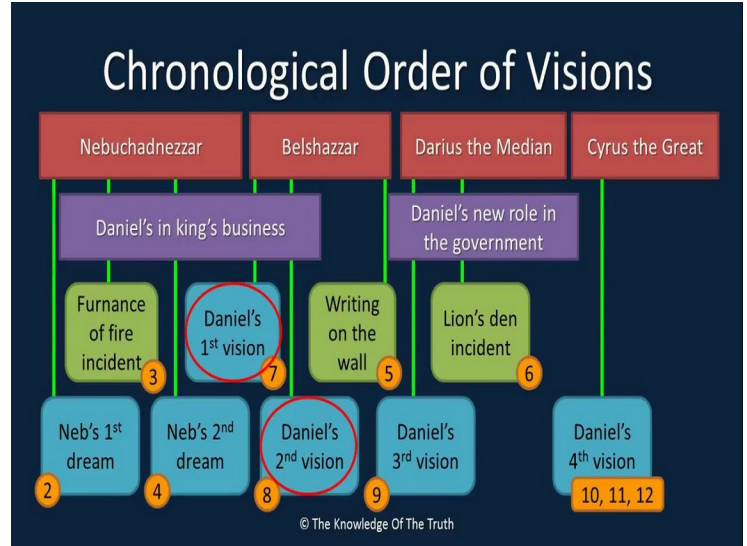

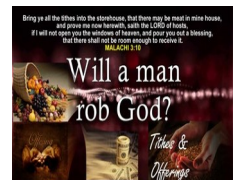
