


Study-3 "Dancing in Movies"

God's Hair Designs Does God really notice hair? Natural length hair for women and girls is the rule of the Bible. Is God wrong? Or people?

Masculine apparel for ladies is also inconsistent with what the Scripture teaches. While such precepts are directed largely toward women, it is out of harmony with the spirit of the Bible to exclude men from requirements related to modesty, jewelry, and simplicity. This is in agreement with the word of God that men avoid having long hair. I Cor 11:14,15.



In some places crossing one's legs when sitting is considered vulgar and wrong. In some places a cross around the neck is considered purity, while in others as idolatry or Roman Catholic. Some places wearing a ball cap backwards means you are a gang member. Wake up if you are blind-I mean blind in these areas-they are real! And especially wake up, if you visit these cultures.

In Old Mexico, using animal illustrations is considered evil and attacking the people, while in America to say that one is as strong as an ox is a compliment. Many curse words are animal names in Spanish countries, like dog, goat, fox, or bull.

Christ, David and others had beards, but because of IDENTIFICATION to some cultures; some styles of hair, mustaches, or beards, have been considered wrong during certain periods of time. We must not confuse morals, fads, culture & personal convictions, so as to follow ignorance. Some

things have to do with certain places and centuries. These have to do with identification or fads, but not morals. The blind and lazy not learning cultures and languages damage much in confusing these, and should stay at home if not seriously learning them.

Sports are not evil among children and adults played as recreation, but under certain conditions:

- (a) That they **not** remove their clothes
- (b) That they **not** play on Sundays,
- (c)That they <u>avoid</u> playing public games that encourage <u>drinking</u>, <u>gambling</u>, <u>lack of clothing</u>, <u>beer</u> <u>advertisements</u>, <u>and smoking</u>.



In Central America, where we have worked, when a sportsman is saved, he usually returns to the world unless he quits playing sports. Sports dominate him through his old friends to the degree that sports have become a vice. This vice is as strong as **drunkenness** that he cannot control. Sport betting, drinking & other evil is part of sports there.

Sports can enslave some people just as much as **164-drun**

Those who were slaves of television or liquor, gambling or nudity, should be careful to keep a distance, even from the internet or videos. Also, the sportsman or fanatic fan, when saved, must be more careful in playing or seeing a little, lest he return to the old <u>vice</u>. We recommend that Christians avoid playing or seeing organized public sports where the "players" are glorified, immodest clothes are worn, alcoholic drinks are sold or Sunday playing takes place.
