City of Avoca	Water Restrictions	<p>All AVOCA RESIDENTS are to follow the following guidelines:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All personal, private, residential gardens (flower or produce), container gardens, etc., are to be watered only during the hours of 8PM - 8AM until further notice. BAN on all lawn irrigation/sprinkler systems until further notice. BAN on vehicle washing at residential locations - vehicle washing ONLY allowed at commercial/business washing stations until further notice. BAN on filling all private/residential swimming pools, jacuzzies, or 2ft & larger portable pools until further notice. <i>Please notify the city if you need pool therapy at home.</i> 	6-8-2021
City of Carson	Level I Water Warning	<p>Due to regional drought conditions the City of Carson has implemented Water Warning Level I of the Water Conservation Plan. <u>The following restrictions apply:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Outdoor watering or irrigation of lawns is prohibited. Outdoor watering of any kind is prohibited between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. daily. Water or irrigation of flower and vegetable gardens, trees and shrubs less than 4 years old, and new seeding or sod is permitted once per week with an application not to exceed one inch. Car washing is prohibited except in commercial establishments that provide that service. No water shall be used to fill private swimming pools, children's wading pools, reflecting pools, or any other outdoor pool or pond. No water shall be used to wash streets, parking lots, driveways, sidewalks, or building exteriors. No water shall be used for nonessential cleaning of commercial and industrial equipment, machinery, and interior spaces. Water shall be served at restaurants only upon the request of the customer. Use of water-consuming comfort air conditioning equipment which consumes in excess of 5 percent of the water circulating in such equipment is prohibited. City of Treynor	Voluntary Water Conservation	Due to current dry conditions and several surrounding communities implementing water restrictions, the City is asking for participation in voluntary water conservation practices. Regional Water RWA	Conservation Action Level YELLOW	<p>All Regional Water users in Pottawattamie County north or east of the City of Neola, are now on Mandatory Water Use Restrictions. Regional Water is asking for residents and businesses in the towns of Avoca and Minden to abide by these additional restrictions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No outdoor watering or irrigation of any kind between 8:00 AM and 8:00 PM. No watering or irrigation of lawns whatsoever. Watering of flowers, vegetable gardens, trees or shrubs less than four years old, and new seedlings is permitted once per week, with an application not to exceed one inch. • No car washing, except at commercial establishments that provide car washing as their only means of income. For commercial car washes, hours of use must be restricted to 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM. • No water shall be used to fill private swimming pools, children’s wading pools, or similar articles. • No water shall be used to clean streets, driveways, sidewalks, etc. • For necessary agricultural and industrial water usages, such as the filling of spraying tanks, reduce the flow rate and fill over a longer period, including overnight, to reduce the instantaneous demand on our system. 	6-4-2021

- Water flow may be reduced or terminated as needed to protect the system's integrity, including to customers who are found to be not following rules.
- Customers with large meters (1" and larger) will pay a higher rate during the June meter reading period, as the last "step rate" shall be suspended.
- Customers of Regional Water who use more water in the June meter reading period than their winter average shall be charged an additional premium of ten cents per one thousand gallons over their winter average. Customers who normally use three thousand gallons or less in the winter and still use only three thousand gallons or less in the June meter reading period will NOT be affected.
