IMPORTANT LEGAL STATUS: This campaign file opens an *inquiry*; it does not declare any House member guilty of treason or any other crime. A vote for final passage of a large authorization bill is not, by itself, proof of criminal intent, disloyalty, bribery, or treason. Any criminal conclusion would require evidence satisfying the applicable law and constitutional protections.

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INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY

What the House did. The U.S. House of Representatives voted on final passage of H.R. 8800, the FY2027 National Defense Authorization Act, on July 22, 2026. The official Clerk of the House records 216 Yeas, 212 Nays, no Present votes, and three members not voting. Every individual listed in the attached roll call is a member of the U.S. House of Representatives recorded for that House vote.

Party breakdown. The Clerk records Republicans: 209 Yea, 7 Nay, 2 Not Voting; Democrats: 6 Yea, 205 Nay, 1 Not Voting; Independent: 1 Yea.

SECTION 219 - U.S.-ISRAEL DEFENSE TECHNOLOGY COOPERATION

The House Rules Committee identifies Section 219 as the **United States-Israel Defense Technology Cooperation Initiative**. The provision directs the Secretary of Defense to designate an executive agent to synchronize cooperative U.S.-Israel efforts involving defense technology research, development, testing, evaluation, integration, and industrial cooperation.

The provision includes potential integration of jointly developed or Israeli-origin technologies into U.S. systems and programs of record; collaborative research; movement of technologies into procurement; frameworks for joint ventures, licensing, and U.S.-based co-production; coordination across Department of Defense entities; and joint training and information-sharing mechanisms.

The House Rules Committee also recorded a bipartisan proposed amendment led by Reps. Thomas Massie and Ro Khanna that sought to strike Section 219. The committee page describes that proposal as targeting the initiative's deep defense-technology integration. The full House final-passage vote, however, was on the entire H.R. 8800 package - not a standalone recorded vote on Section 219.

TREASON INQUIRY - LEGAL THRESHOLD

The Constitution deliberately defines treason narrowly. Article III, Section 3 provides that treason against the United States consists only of levying war against the United States, or adhering to its enemies, giving them aid and comfort. Federal criminal law, 18 U.S.C. § 2381, implements that narrow offense. The Constitution also imposes an unusually demanding proof rule for conviction.

Accordingly, this file should treat possible treason as an investigative question requiring evidence - not as a conclusion inferred from a legislative vote. A policy judgment that Section 219 compromises U.S. sovereignty or creates excessive foreign military integration is distinct from proving the constitutional crime of treason.

CONGRESSIONAL IMMUNITY / INVESTIGATIVE LIMIT

Article I's Speech or Debate Clause provides substantial protection for legislative acts. Any future investigation should therefore distinguish the protected act of voting and legislating from independently provable conduct outside the legislative sphere, such as unlawful financial transactions, bribery, undisclosed conflicts, prohibited foreign-agent activity, or other conduct if supported by evidence.

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RESEARCH QUESTIONS FOR OPERATION PUBLIC TRUST

- Who drafted, sponsored, requested, or materially shaped Section 219, and what public legislative history documents that process?
- What communications, lobbying disclosures, campaign-finance records, gifts, travel, or financial relationships are lawfully available in public records concerning organizations or persons advocating for or against the provision?
- What safeguards govern classified information, export controls, intellectual property, cybersecurity, procurement, and U.S. operational independence under the initiative?
- What amendments sought to remove or narrow Section 219, which were made in order, and which received recorded votes?
- What is the Senate's corresponding language, and what differences would have to be reconciled before final enactment?
- Did any member publicly explain their final-passage vote or their position specifically on Section 219?
- Is there independently verifiable evidence of bribery, undisclosed conflicts, unlawful foreign influence, or other conduct separate from the protected legislative vote?
