But Jesus demurred, and said: "My teaching is not mine, but his that sent me. If any man **willeth** to do his will, he shall know of the teaching, whether it is of God, or whether I speak from myself" (John 7:16-17). Jesus' point to the devout temple Jews was no different than the one He had made earlier to the legalistic Pharisees. God has imbued mankind with the ability to **choose**. If a person **wills**, he can accept God and His teaching, but God never will force Himself on that person. As the apostle John brought the book of Revelation to a close, he wrote: "He that will, let him take the water of life freely" (Revelation 22:17). The operative phrase here, of course, is "he that will."

But what of he that will not? Freedom is accompanied by responsibility. With freedom of choice comes the responsibility to think carefully, choose wisely, and act forcefully. Freedom of choice always works best when tempered with wisdom and good judgment. Thus, in every human activity the process of recognizing, believing, and properly utilizing truth is vitally important. Especially is this true in the spiritual realm. Jesus tried to impress this upon His generation when He said: "Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). What we as

humans so often fail to realize is that we are not involved in a search for truth because **it** is lost; we are involved in a search for truth because without it, **we** are!

Some, however, have elected to employ their freedom of choice to ignore the truth regarding God's existence and to disobey His Word. They are the spiritual descendants of the first-century Pharisees; they **could** come to a knowledge of the truth, but they **will not**. The simple fact of the matter is that we are responsible for what we choose to believe. Using the personal volition with which God has endowed us, we may choose freely to believe in Him, or we may choose just as freely to disbelieve. The choice is up to each individual. And once that individual has made up his mind to disbelieve, God will not deter him, as Paul made clear when he wrote his second epistle to the Thessalonians. In that letter, he spoke first of those who "received not the love of the truth" (2:10), and then went on to say that "for this cause God sendeth them a working of error, that they should believe a lie" (2 Thessalonians 2:11)

What, exactly, was Paul suggesting? Was the apostle teaching that God **purposely** causes men to believe error? No, he was not. Paul's point in this passage was that we may choose to accept something as the truth when, in fact, it is false. Because God has granted man personal volition, and because He has provided within the Bible the rules, regulations, and guidelines to govern that personal volition, He therefore will refrain from overriding man's freedom of choice—even when that choice violates His law. God will not contravene man's decisions, or interfere with the actions based on those decisions. The prophet Isaiah recorded God's words on this subject many years before when he wrote:

Yea, they have chosen their own ways, and their soul delighteth in their abominations: I also will choose their delusions, and will bring their fears upon them; because when I called, none did answer; when I spake, they did not hear: but they did that which was evil in mine eyes, and chose that wherein I delighted not (Isaiah 66:3-4).

Concerning the people who refused to have God in their knowledge, and who exchanged truth for error, Paul repeatedly stated that "God gave them up" (Romans 1:24,26,28). In his commentary on the Thessalonian epistles, Raymond C. Kelcy addressed the fact that men often prefer the consequences of a certain belief system, and that as a result God gives the man over to the belief of the lie which he prefers. In a sense it might be said that the means by which a person is deceived is God's permissive agency—not God's direct agency (Cited from Apologetics Press.org "The Many Faces and Causes of Unbelief", Bert Thomson Ph.D.)

A Prayer

Pray to God daily for the wisdom, understanding, knowledge and insight that comes from the Father, His Son Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit from the inspired written Word of God, God's Holy Word (Proverbs 1:1-7 NASB, Proverbs 4:5-9 NASB, Romans 15:14, 1 Corinthians 1:4-9, 2 Corinthians 2:14, James 1:5,17,3:17, and this will help us to grow as we study God's Holy Word (Psalms 111:2, 2 Timothy 2:15 KJV, 2 Peter 1:3-11), and pray for help in doing His

will (Matthew 7:21, Matthew 17:5, Matthew 21:28-31, John 9:31, Acts 3:22-23, 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8), and help with discerning between good and evil (Genesis 3:22, Proverbs 2:6-11, Proverbs 14:8-9 NASB, Proverbs 16:21 NASB, Proverbs 17:24 NASB, Philippians 1:9, James 1:5-6 NASB, James 3:13-18, Hebrews 5:12-14 NASB), and help with discerning what pleases them (Proverbs 16:7, Matthew 5:43-48, Romans 8:1-14 NASB, Romans 12:17-21, 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, Colossians 3:20, 1 Thessalonians 2:4, 1 Timothy 2:1-6 KJV, 2 Timothy 2:4, Hebrews 11:6, James 2:5, 1 John 3:18-24). And pray to be a light of His Son Lord Jesus Christ (Matthew 5:14-16, Luke 11:33-36, Philippians 2:15-16), and to be salt of the earth (Matthew 5:13, Mark 9:50, Luke 4:21-22, Luke 14:34-35, Ephesians 4:29 NASB, Colossians 4:6 NASB, 1 Peter 3:15 NASB), and protecting us and our loved ones from evil men and the evil one as we seek His kingdom and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33, John 17:15, Philippians 2:12-13, 2 Thessalonians 3:1-3, 1 John 3:4-10, 1 John 5:18), and pray for our daily bread (Deuteronomy 8:3, Proverbs 10:3, Matthew 6:11, John 6:27), and that we may not enter into temptation (Matthew 26:41, <u>Luke 22:40, 1 Corinthians 10:13</u>), pray for the forgiveness of our sins (<u>Psalms 32:5</u>, <u>Proverbs</u> 10:3, Matthew 6:12, Matthew 6:12, 1 John 1:9), and pray for our strength and courage every day (2 Corinthians 5:6-10, Philippians 4:13, 2 Timothy 4:17, 1 Peter 4:11), and pray for peace of Christ to rule our hearts (John 14:27, John 16:33, Philippians 4:6-7, Ephesians 2:11-17, Colossians 3:12-17), and be thankful (Romans 6:17, 1 Corinthians 15:57, 2 Corinthians 2:14, Philippians 4:6, 2 Thessalonians 2:13 ASV), and pray always, that we may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man." (Luke 21:36 KJV).

War & The Early Church - Eureka church of Christ

Nevertheless, Christian writers tended to oppose Christian participation in war even when they accepted the institution of war. Roland Bainton's comment is apt: "The age of persecution down to the time of Constantine was the age of pacifism to the degree that during this period no Christian author to our knowledge approved of Christians participation in battle."[1]

Professor George Kalantizis (an Evangelical author and Director of The Wheaton Center for Early Christian Studies at Wheaton College), after having thoroughly studied all of the pertinent texts, comes to the conclusion that there is no ambivalence in any of the pre-Nicene writers on this issue. He concludes that ALL the Ante-Nicene Fathers who speak on the topic consistently oppose killing because of the teachings of Jesus. For example, he says:

Only then are we able to evaluate the oppositions of the earliest Christians to war, and killing, and of serving in the armies of Caesar from within their own social location and ask questions of theology and practice. When we do that, we see that there is no polyglossia among the Christian writers. With remarkable univocity they speak of participation in the Christian mysteries as antithetical to killing, and the practices of the army, whether in wartime or peacetime. The dominical command to love one's enemies and pray for one's persecutors is a common thread woven throughout these documents. Greek and Latin writers alike speak of this uniqueness of the Christian communities.[2]

Dr. Everett Ferguson, the Professor of Church History (Emeritus) at Abilene Christian University, comes to this conclusion about the early Christian attitude toward participation in military operations: "The opposition of the theologians was to killing. The sayings of Jesus and the whole of his teaching were felt to be contrary to active participation in warfare."[3] And in his discussion on Tertullian (c. 160-230 A.D.), who wrote very plainly against Christians killing in the military and against Christians entering the army after conversion, Ferguson says that, "Tertullian's views were often highly individual, but on the question of a Christian serving in the army his thought appears to have been in harmony with that of the other leading thinkers and spokesmen of Christianity at his time."[4]

Dr. Lee C. Camp, professor of ethics and theology at Lipscomb University says, "All extant Christian writings prior to the fourth century reject the practice of Christians killing in warfare... They rejected killing in warfare, in short, because it violated the way and teaching of Christ."[5] Camp's evaluation of the ancient Christian faith on this matter is in perfect harmony with the understanding of the founder of Lipscomb University, David Lipscomb (b. Jan 21, 1831 – d. Nov 11, 1917). In David Lipscomb's discussion on civil government and the kingdom of God, he argues that the teaching of separation from civil government including the Christian abstaining from killing for the government is apostolic and says that this was the position of the early Church.

We have noted these things from the days of the apostles down to one hundred years ago, to show that the idea of separation from the state and from all participation in civil affairs, was universal among Christians for the first two or three hundred years. [6]

David W. Bercot, the editor of *A Dictionary of Early Christian Beliefs*, who has read all the writings of the Ante-Nicene Fathers available, reports in his audio CD entitled *What the Early Christians Believed about War*, that...

Every single writer who discusses the subject of war or violence or anything like that, they all present the same view, that we are to love our enemies, that war is wrong, that a Christian cannot take up the sword no matter what the evil is on the other side. We do not combat evil using the means of evil. And this went against everything that the world at that time knew, against Roman culture, against Jewish culture because it was revolutionary. It was from the teachings of Jesus Christ. And you will not find as I said even a singlewriter who takes a contrary view. [7]

Verse 24

Every one therefore that heareth these words of mine, and doeth them, shall be likened unto a wise man, who built his house upon the rock.

The key to everlasting life is in Jesus' saying, "these words of mine!" Throughout the New Testament, the final, ultimate and exclusive authority in true religion is the word spoken by Christ. Jesus commanded the church to teach "whatsoever I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:20). He declared that the words he spoke would judge men at the last day (John 12:48). The true religion was "first spoken" by Christ (Hebrews 2:3). "Whosoever goeth onward and abideth not in the teaching of Christ, hath not God (2 John 1:1:9). Apostles warned that men ought to learn how "not to go beyond the things which are written" (1 Corinthians 4:6). "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly" (Colossians 3:16), Jesus said, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away" (Matthew 24:35). The most important fact to know with reference to Christianity is that it is "of Christ"! Not even the apostles were commissioned to go beyond the word of Christ. Even the reception of the Holy Spirit in their hearts was not for the purpose of imparting additional truth but for bringing to their remembrance the things Christ taught (John 14:26). The current notion that any man in whom the Holy Spirit is supposed to dwell may properly determine the true nature and content of Christian doctrine is emphatically denied in the affirmation of Christ that, even in the apostles, the Holy Spirit did not speak "of himself." "For he shall not speak from himself; but what things soever he shall hear, these shall he speak ... for he shall take of mine, and shall declare it unto you" (John 16:13-15).

Wise man who built his house upon the rock. The "rock" is nothing more nor less than "these words of mine," namely, the words of Christ.

Verse 25

And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon the rock.

Rains, floods, and winds, in this place, suggest oppositions from above, beneath, and all around. The stability of the wise man's house was due to the fact that it was built, not upon "a rock," but upon "THE rock"! Only the life founded upon and guided by the principles of Christ shall stand. His teaching is the rock; all else is shifting sand.

Verse 26

And everyone that heareth these words of mine, and doeth them not, shalt be likened unto a foolish man, who built his house upon the sand: and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew, and smote upon that house; and it fell: and great was the fall thereof. All this is a recapitulation, in the negative, of what was said immediately before. The focus of attention here should be upon the revelation of what the true rock actually is, namely, the words

or teachings of Christ. This is the point so many seem to miss. (Cited from: <u>Coffman's Commentaries on the Bible Matthew 7 StudyLight.org</u>).
