

Only the context indicates whether [4100](#) /pisteúō ("believe") is self-serving (without sacred meaning), or the believing that leads to/proceeds from God's inbirthing of faith.

* To **Repent** is a change of mind and a change of actions. "Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out".

God showed His love for us by being born in their image, and have been given a soul that lasts for eternity ([Genesis 1:26-27](#), [Matthew 16:26](#), [Romans 5:8-10](#), [Ephesians 2:4-9](#), [Colossians 1:1-27](#), [1 Thessalonians 5:1-24](#), [2 Thessalonians 2:13-17](#), [Hebrews 3:1-4:16](#), [1 Peter 2:11](#), [1 John 4:7-9](#)).

God showed His love for us by sending His Son our Lord Jesus Christ to die on the cross for all mankind so that we should not perish and be condemned to everlasting punishment ([Matthew 25:31-46](#), [2 Thessalonians 1:5-9](#), [Hebrews 10:26-31](#), [Jude 1:5-7 NASB](#)), but provide a way to eternal life ([Matthew 25:31-46](#), [Mark 16:15-16](#), [John 3:16-17](#), [John 10:27-30](#)) into the heavenly kingdom ([Daniel 7:14,27](#), [2 Corinthians 4:16-5:10](#), [Hebrews 9:18-29](#), [2 Peter 1:1-11](#)).

To begin this new journey in life to an eternal life of love, joy and peace you must have faith ([Acts 3:1-16](#), [Acts 6:1-7](#), [Acts 20:17-21](#), [Acts 26:12-23](#), [Romans 1:1-10](#), [Romans 5:1-5](#), [Romans 12:3 NASB](#), [1 Corinthians 2:1-5](#), [2 Corinthians 5:2-10](#), [Ephesians 2:11-22](#), [Hebrews 11:1-6](#), [James 1:2-8](#), [1 John 5:1-8](#)). And you must hear or read the word of God about the gospel of His beloved Son Jesus Christ, ([Matthew 7:24-29](#), [John 1:12-13](#), [Acts 16:14-15 ASV](#), [Romans 1:16-17 NASB](#), [Romans 10:17 NASB](#), [Galatians 3:2](#), [1 John 5:13](#), [Jude 1:3](#)).

Faith ([4102](#)/pistis) is always a gift from God, and never something that can be produced by people. In short, [4102](#)/pistis ("faith") for the believer is "God's divine persuasion" – and therefore distinct from human belief (confidence), yet involving it. The Lord continuously births faith in the yielded believer so they can know what He prefers, i.e. the persuasion of His will ([1 Jn 5:4](#)).

[[4102](#) (pistis) in secular antiquity referred to a guarantee (warranty). In Scripture, faith is God's warranty, certifying that the revelation He inbirthed will come to pass (His way).

Faith ([4102](#)/pistis) is also used collectively – of all the times God has revealed (given the persuasion of) His will, which includes the full revelation of Scripture ([Jude 3](#)). Indeed, God the Lord guarantees that all of this revelation will come to pass! Compare [Mt 5:18](#) with [2 Tim 3:16](#).]

1. The root of [4102/pistis](#) ("faith") is [3982/peithō](#) ("to persuade, be persuaded") which supplies the core-meaning of faith ("divine persuasion"). It is God's warranty that guarantees the fulfillment of the revelation He births within the receptive believer (cf. [1 Jn 5:4](#) with [Heb 11:1](#)).

Faith ([4102/pistis](#)) is always received from God, and never generated by us.

[Ro 12:3](#): "For through the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think more highly of himself than he ought to think; but to think so as to have sound judgment, as God has allotted to each a measure of faith ([4102/pistis](#))" (NASU).

[Eph 2:8,9](#): " For by grace you have been saved through faith ([4102/pistis](#)); and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; ⁹not as a result of works, so that no one may boast" (NASU).

[5485](#) (*xáris*) is preeminently used of the Lord's favor – freely extended to give Himself away to people (because He is "always leaning toward them").

To be a child of God does not mean to listen to man, but to read and listen to God's inspired word ([Psalms 119:9-11](#), [Psalms 119:101,103,105,116,120,130,133,140](#), [Mark 12:18-26](#), [Romans 15:4-12](#), [Ephesians 4:1-16](#), [2 Timothy 3:16 NASB](#), [Hebrews 4:12-13](#), [2 Peter 1:19-21 NASB](#)) about the life and work of His beloved Son ([Matthew 13:37-38](#), [Matthew 28:18-20](#), [Luke 1:1-4](#), [Luke 19:1-10](#), [Luke 24:1-49](#), [John 1:1-29](#), [John 14:1-31](#), [Acts 1:1-4](#), [Romans 10:1-17](#), [1 Peter 2:21-25 NASB](#)), and His Apostles teachings ([Acts 1:1-2](#), [Acts 2:42](#), [Romans 1:1-7](#)), and the Hebrews writer ([Hebrews 1:1-4](#)), and the Lord's brothers James and Jude ([Matthew 13:55 NASB](#), [1 Corinthians 9:5](#), [James 1:1](#), [Jude 1:1](#)), and the former teachings and examples of the Old Testament revealed by the Holy Spirit ([John 16:5-15](#), [Romans 15:4](#), [2 Timothy 3:16](#), [2 Peter 1:19-21 NASB](#)).

These scriptural verses and passages are just but some of the messages in the scriptures that people within the darkness of this world that cause divisions ([Romans 16:17](#), [Titus 3:8-10](#), [Jude 1:17-19 NASB](#)), and certain men who have crept in privately who are ungodly men, who turn the God into lewdness and deny the only Lord God and our Lord Jesus Christ ([Galatians 2:4-5](#), [Jude 1:3-4 NASB](#), [2 Timothy 3:1-7 NASB](#)), some preach another gospel that is contrary to the gospel that was given us ([Galatians 1:6-9](#)), and those who try to take an opportunity to be regarded as apostles or disguise themselves as apostles of Christ for such men are false prophets and deceitful workers, and even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light ([2 Corinthians 11:2-14 NASB](#), [Ephesians 4:14](#), [2 Peter 2:1-3](#), [Revelation 2:2](#)), some distort and corrupt with their false beliefs and a different doctrine of Christ ([1 Timothy 6:3-5](#)), there are deceitful and blind guides

([Matthew 15:13-14](#), [Colossians 2:8](#)), self-made religions ([Colossians 2:18-23](#), [1 Timothy 4:1-3](#)), deceitful spirits and doctrines of demons ([1 Timothy 4:1 NASB](#)), traditions and doctrines and commandments of men ([Matthew 15:7-9](#)), false teachers ([1 Timothy 1:3-7](#), [2 Timothy 4:3](#), [2 Peter 2:1-3](#)), and false christs and false prophets ([Matthew 7:15](#), [Matthew 24:11](#), [Matthew 24:24](#), [2 Peter 2:1-3](#), [1 John 4:1](#)), distorting and corrupting the hearts and minds of men, women, and children.

One Body

Churches of Christ

Many churches of Christ ([Romans 16:16](#)) are independent congregations having no connection with any religious organization, whether protestant, catholic, orthodox, Pentecostal, Calvinistic, new age, or anything else. Rather, their members are happy to be simply Christians, following the New Testament and learning from the Old Testament, Gods' Holy word.

This is why many of you are weak and ill and why some have passed away ([1 Corinthians 11:30](#)), we need to discern ourselves and judge ourselves truthfully so that we would not be judged ([1 Corinthians 11:31](#)), if we are judged by the Lord and we will be disciplined so that we will not be condemned along with the world ([1 Corinthians 11:32](#)), so when we come together to partake of the Lord's Supper we need to wait for one another and if anyone is hungry they need to eat at home ([1 Corinthians 11:20-22](#)) so that when we come together it will not be for judgement ([1 Corinthians 11:33-34](#)). For as often as we eat this bread and drink this cup we are proclaiming the Lord's death until He comes ([1 Corinthians 11:26](#)).

We also learn of God's inspired word ([Acts 2:42](#), [Philippians 1:9-10](#), [Colossians 3:16](#), [Titus 2:11-14](#), [2 Peter 1:1-11](#)) and fellowship with each other ([Acts 2:42](#), [1 Corinthians 1:4-9](#), [2 Corinthians 6:14](#), [2 Corinthians 13:14](#), [Philippians 2:1-5 NASB](#), [1 John 1:1-10](#)), and sharing from our prosperity for the ministry of the Gospel, to aid missionaries, to aid communities visited by calamity or disaster, and to help those outside the body in need especially those of the house of faith ([Proverbs 3:27](#), [Matthew 25:31-40](#), [Acts 2:42](#), [Romans 12:13](#), [Romans 15:16](#), [1 Corinthians 16:2](#), [2 Corinthians 8:1-4](#), [2 Corinthians 9:6-15](#), [Galatians 6:6-10](#), [Titus 2:11-14](#), [Hebrews 13:16](#), [James 2:14-18](#), [1 John 3:17-18](#)), and to strengthen others and be strengthened, to encourage and be encouraged ([1 Thessalonians 4:13-18](#), [1 Thessalonians 5:4-11](#), [Hebrews 10:19-25](#)).

There is an invitation to visitors and listeners to be part of the body, the church, Church of Christ, in Christ, to begin a walk in newness of life ([Romans 6:4](#), [Romans 7:6](#), [2 Corinthians 5:17](#), [Galatians 6:15](#), [Ephesians 4:17-24](#), [Colossians 3:5-11](#)) being faithful until death ([Matthew 16:26](#), [Luke 8:15](#), [Luke 21:19](#), [Romans 5:1-5](#), [Romans 8:18-25](#), [Hebrews 10:35-39](#), [Hebrews 12:1-17 ASV](#), [James 1:3-4](#), [James 5:10-11](#), [1 Peter 2:19-25](#), [1 Peter 3:14-17 KJV](#), [Revelation 2:10-11](#), [Revelation 3:10-11](#)). There is also an invitation for any brother or sister in Christ that needs encouragement, prayers, or help with coming back to the Lord ([Matthew 6:14-15](#), [Matthew 18:21-22](#), [Mark 11:25](#), [Acts 14:22](#), [Acts 15:30-31](#), [2 Corinthians 2:5-11](#), [Galatians 6:1-2](#), [Colossians 3:12-14](#), [1 Thessalonians 3:2-4 NASB](#), [1 Thessalonians 5:14-15](#)).

The day of celebration that has been given to us as written in the New Testament consists of one day that is celebrated fifty-two times a year, known as the Lords Day, the First Day of the Week, Sunday ([Matthew 28:1-10](#), [Mark 16:1-16 NASB](#), [Luke 24:1-26](#), [John 20:1-20](#), [Acts 2:42-44](#), [Acts 20:7](#), [Romans 12:1-13](#), [Romans 16:16](#), [1 Corinthians 11:17-31](#), [1 Corinthians 16:1-2](#), [2 Corinthians 9:1-12](#), [Galatians 1:8-9](#), [Hebrews 10:&24-25](#), [Revelation 1:10](#)).

We also need to be of sound and sober mind striving to live a life closer to the honor and glory that is part of the body, the church, Church of Christ, in Christ, for the sake of our prayers along with keeping fervent in our love for one another ([Romans 2:1-10](#), [1 Corinthians 10:31-33](#), [Ephesians 5:15-21](#), [Colossians 3:1-24](#), [1 Peter 4:7-9](#)).

In [Luke 9:23](#) our Lord Jesus Christ commands us to deny-self, take up our cross daily and follow him.

In [Matthew 5:13](#) our Lord Jesus Christ has given us guidance about being the salt of the earth.

In [Matthew 5:14-16](#) we are to become the light of our Lord Jesus Christ to others.

In [Matthew 5:22-26](#) (if we have angered or someone has angered us, we are to resolve those differences and reconcile with them before we can attend worship services). We are to be at peace with one another ([Isaiah 26:3, 27:5, 32:17, 57:19, Mark 9:50, Luke 1:79, John 14:27, Romans 14:17, 15:13, Galatians 5:22, Ephesians 2:12-18, Philippians 4:7, Colossians 3:15, 2 Thessalonians 3:16, Hebrews 12:14, 13:20-21, James 3:18, 1 Peter 3:8-12, 2 Peter 3:10-15](#)).

In [Matthew 18:32-35](#) we are told **we will be tormented by the jailer if we do not show mercy and forgive from our heart** as we have been shown mercy and forgiveness ([Matthew 6:12-15, Romans 6:17-18, Ephesians 4:31-32, Colossians 3:12-16, Hebrews 12:14, James 2:12-13](#)).

In [1 Thessalonians 1:2-4](#) we need to be thankful to God for our brothers and sisters in the body as we pray for them remembering their work of faith, and labor in love, and their steadfastness in hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

In [1 Thessalonians 5:12-14](#) we are to respect our leaders who rule over us in the Lord in the church that admonish us and to esteem them very highly because of their work, and to be at peace among yourselves, also we are to admonish the idle, encourage the fainthearted, help the weak in faith, and be patient with them all.

In [1 Timothy 2:1-3 KJV](#) we are to strive to lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and honestly in every way.

In [1 Timothy 6:11-12 NASB](#) we are to pursue righteous, godliness, faith, love and perseverance and gentleness, to fight the good fight of faith, take hold of the eternal life of which you were called.

In [Titus 2:11-15 NASB](#) we are instructed to deny ungodliness and worldly desires, to live sensibly, righteously and godly in this present age, looking for the blessed hope and the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify himself a people for His own possession who are zealous for good works.

In [Hebrews 6:10-12](#) as it is written: For God is not unjust so as to overlook your work and the love that you have shown for his name in serving the saints, as you still do. And we desire each one of you to show the same earnestness to have the full assurance of hope until the end, so that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.

In [Hebrews 13:7](#) we are to remember our leaders that have passed away that you heard the word of God from and consider the outcome of their life and imitate their faith.

In [Hebrews 13:17](#) we are to obey our leaders and submit to them, for they watch over our souls. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning.

In [3 John 1:11](#) we are told to not to imitate evil but what is good. The one who does good is of God. The one who does evil has not seen God. Good is referenced here as good conduct and evil as bad conduct. Good conduct is also referenced being what is right that is eternal, and what is wrong being referenced as being unreconcilable.

We are to be obedient to rulers and authorities ([Romans 13:1-4](#), [Titus 3:1 NASB](#), [1 Peter 2:13](#)) to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle (patient), to malign no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing every consideration for all men ([Titus 3:2 NASB](#)).

We are to "honor everyone, love the brotherhood, fear God, honor the emperor" ([1 Peter 2:17](#)).

We are to "strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord ([Hebrews 12:14](#)). Holiness is being separated from the world of worldly desires and ungodliness ([Mark 4:19,8:36](#), [Luke 12:13-21](#), [John 8:44](#), [Acts 26:18](#), [Romans 1:18,13:14](#), [1 Corinthians 6:5-11](#), [Galatians 5:16-17,24](#), [Ephesians 2:3,4:22](#), [1 Timothy 6:9](#), [2 Timothy 2:16](#), [Titus 2:11-13,3:9-11](#), [2 Peter 3:3](#), [1 John 2:16-17](#), [Jude 1:16](#)) and being separated to God the Father, His Son and the Holy Spirit, putting them first and being dedicated, obedient, faithful and sanctified in truth ([Matthew 6:19-34](#), [Luke 12:22-31](#), [John 17:1-24 ASV](#), [Acts 11:23,20:32,26:18](#), [Romans 6:13 ASV](#), [Romans 6:15-23 NASB](#), [Romans 6:19 ASV](#), [Romans 12:1 ASV](#), [1 Corinthians 4:2,6:9-11](#), [Philippians 2:1-16](#), [Titus 3:1-8](#), [1 Peter 1:3-25](#), [1 Peter 2:5](#), [Revelation 2:10](#)).

We are to love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you ([Matthew 5:44](#)), and you shall love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, all thy soul, all thy mind and all thy strength and love thy neighbor as thyself ([Matthew 22:37-40](#)).

Our Lord Jesus Christ tell us if you keep His commandments you will abide in His love and His joy will be yours and God our Father will love you ([John 14:21](#), [John 14:23](#), [John 15:10-14](#)). The love of our Lord Jesus Christ comes from keeping His word and the love of the God our Father comes from loving His Son and doing all that he asks ([John 14:15, 21-24](#), [Jude 1:21](#))

Our Lord Jesus Christ as he is the radiance of the Glory of God and exact imprint of His nature and upholds the universe with the word of His power ([Hebrews 1:1-14](#)).

Within our hearts we are to make Christ the Lord as Holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with meekness and fear ([1 Peter 3:15 KJV](#)).

The meekness is one of the fruits of the spirit that we all need to bear so as we share our faith in Christ ([Galatians 5:22-23 ASV](#)) we need to be humble ([James 4:6](#), [1 Peter 5:5-6](#)), and we need to conduct ourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity as we try to persuade others to become Christians ([Ephesians 5:15-16](#), [Colossians 4:5](#)), we need to pray that that our speech is always with grace, as though seasoned with salt so that we will know how to respond to each person ([Colossians 4:6](#)), and strive to always trying to have a good conscience, so that when we are slandered, those who revile our good behavior in Christ may be put to shame ([1 Peter 3:16](#)).

In the inspired word of God, in the first century several of the faithful baptized believers in the body, the church, Church of Christ, worshiped God from their houses as noted in ([Romans 16:3-5](#), [Colossians 4:15](#), [Philemon 1:2](#)), seeing this as an example that allows us to do the same if there is no healthy Church of Christ or a mission from a Church of Christ near you. Do not let anyone tell you anything different or discourage you in anyway.

The Lord's church is called the "Church of Christ" ([Romans 16:16](#)) with either a name in front or behind like "New Milford Church of Christ" or "Church of Christ of New Milford."

There are many Churches of Christ around the world but like all things there have been some who have turned aside from the bible and the gospel of truth and have become an unhealthy body of Christ with adding women preachers ([1 Corinthians 14:33-35](#), [1 Timothy 2:12-14](#)), musical instruments, bands, a church choir ([Matthew 26:30](#), [Mark 14:26](#), [Acts 16:25](#), [Romans 15:9-11](#), [1 Corinthians 14:15,26](#), [Ephesians 5:19](#), [Colossians 3:16](#), [Hebrews 2:12](#), [Hebrews 13:15](#), [James 5:13](#), [Revelation 5:9](#), [Revelation 14:3](#), [Revelation 15:3](#)), doctrines, and or traditions and or commandments from men and not from the inspired word of God ([Matthew 15:9](#), [Romans 16:17](#), [Ephesians 4:14](#), [2 Thessalonians 2:15](#), [1 Timothy 1:3,8-10](#), [Titus 1:5-9](#), [Titus 2:1-10](#)) these are all unhealthy Churches of Christ and you should avoid them.

In these self-made religions that gather in these city, or community churches, chapels, worship centers, synagogues, mosques, temples, spiritual centers, or monasteries and denominational churches that are named as Catholic, Protestant, Baptist, Methodist, Anglican, Episcopalian, Lutheran, Pentecostal, Seventh Day Adventists, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Jehovah Witnesses, the Mormons, Anabaptist Christian, Mennonites, etc....they do not worship in spirit and in truth ([John 4:23-24](#)), and for God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit ([Genesis 1:1](#), [Genesis 1:26-27](#), [Matthew 28:18-20](#), [Luke 1:35](#), [John 1:1-5](#), [1 Corinthians 6:19](#), [2 Corinthians 13:14](#), [Ephesians 2:22](#)) to accept our worship we must worship them in spirit and in truth ([John 4:23-24](#)).

It wasn't until the disciples were in Antioch that they were first called Christians ([Acts 11:26](#)), and to become a Christian you need to hear the gospel ([Romans 10:14-17 NASB](#), [Colossians 1:3-5](#)), and believe in the gospel ([Mark 16:15-16](#), [John 20:30-31 NASB](#), [Acts 8:12](#)), repent of your sins ([Luke 13:1-5](#), [Acts 3:17-23](#)), confess Jesus is the Christ the Son of the God

([Matthew 16:16](#), [Matthew 26:63-64](#), [Acts 10:34-43](#), [Romans 10:8-10](#), [1 Corinthians 6:11](#)), be baptized ([Matthew 28:18-20](#), [Mark 16:15-16](#), [Acts 2:36-38](#)), and be obedient and faithful unto death ([Revelation 2:10-11](#), [Revelation 3:10-13](#)).

Today there are all these self-made religions ([Colossians 2:20-23](#)) which many have woman preachers ([1 Corinthians 14:33-35](#), [1 Timothy 2:12-14](#)), and many use musical instruments, church choirs and bands ([Matthew 26:30](#), [Mark 14:26](#), [Acts 16:25](#), [Romans 15:9-11](#), [1 Corinthians 14:15,26](#), [Ephesians 5:19](#), [Colossians 3:16](#), [Hebrews 2:12](#), [Hebrews 13:15](#), [James 5:13](#), [Revelation 5:9](#), [Revelation 14:3](#), [Revelation 15:3](#)). Many have distorted the truth on the forgiveness of sins ([Matthew 26:26-28](#), [Acts 2:38](#), [Acts 5:29-32](#), [Acts 13:38-39](#), [Ephesians 1:13-14](#), [Colossians 1:13-14](#), [1 John 1:1-10](#)) and they do not honor the memorial from our Lord on the Lord's supper to be observed ([Matthew 23:8-9](#), [Acts 2:42](#), [Acts 20:7-11](#), [1 Corinthians 11:20-34](#), [1 Corinthians 16:1-2](#)). They preach contrary to the gospel that was given us in the inspired word of God ([Romans 16:17-18](#), [1 Corinthians 1:10-13](#), [1 Corinthians 3:1-9](#), [1 Corinthians 11:17-26](#), [Galatians 5:19-24](#), [Jude 1:17-21](#)), and they are to be accursed ([Galatians 1:6-12](#)).

These are just but a few of the scriptural verses and passages that address the head of the body, the church, Church of Christ ([Genesis 3:15](#), [Matthew 16:18](#), [Acts 20:28](#), [1 Corinthians 11:3](#), [1 Corinthians 15:25-27](#), [Ephesians 1:22-23](#), [Ephesians 4:4,15-16](#), [Ephesians 5:23](#), [Colossians 1:24](#), [Colossians 2:10, 2:19](#), [Hebrews 2:1-10](#)).

The following article was cited from the Northwest Church of Christ titled "[Christ & His Church](#)" addressing the Church of Christ, the body, divisions, and salvation.

Jesus promised to build His church ([Matthew 16:18](#)). It began on Pentecost after His resurrection in the city of Jerusalem ([Acts 2](#)). When the gospel of Christ was preached the people asked, "What shall we do?" ([v. 37](#)). The apostle Peter told them to repent and be baptized for the remission of sins ([v. 38](#)). "Then those who gladly received His word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them... And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved" ([vv. 41, 47](#)).

Whenever and wherever that same gospel is preached, and people respond in that same way God adds them to that same church. Jesus never wanted the church to be divided into different denominations. He prayed that His disciples be one ([John 17:20-23](#)). He purchased the church with His own blood ([Acts 20:28](#)). It belongs to Him.

The apostle Paul vigorously condemned division in the church ([1 Corinthians 1:10-13](#)). He reminded us that Christ is not divided, that Paul was not crucified for us, and that we were not baptized into the name of Paul. It is by Christ's sacrifice and by His name that we are saved and added to His church (not that of some mere human). And Paul also taught that Jesus is the head of the church, which is His body ([Ephesians 1:22-23](#)), that there is one body ([4:4](#)), that Jesus is the Savior of the body ([5:23](#)), and that He loved the church and gave Himself for her ([v. 25](#)).

Salvation is found in Jesus Christ ([2 Timothy 2:10](#)) and all the saved are in His church ([Acts 2:47](#)). When we are baptized into Christ for salvation ([Mark 16:15-16](#); [Acts 22:16](#); [Romans 6:3-4](#); [Galatians 3:26-27](#); [Colossians 2:12](#)) we are baptized into His church ([1 Corinthians 12:13](#)).

The gospel of Christ calls all people **out** of sin and the world, with its false religions and man-made denominations, and **into** Christ and His church ([Acts 2:39](#); [2 Thessalonians 2:13-14](#); [1 Peter 2:9-10](#)).

Do you belong to Christ and His church? Does the church mean as much to you as it does to Christ? (Cited from the Northwest Church of Christ titled "[Christ & His Church](#)")
