Synopsis

When the reverend's rebellious daughter sets her sights on Ren, her roughneck boyfriend tries to sabotage Ren's reputation, with many of the locals eager to believe the worst about the new kid. Footloose

Inspired by a true story

A law enacted in the 1800s prohibited dancing anywhere within city limits of Elmore City, Oklahoma. Year after year, local students had requested to host a prom and had been refused. Any dance would violate the law and the school board would never approve it.

According to Dean Worsham, the Principal at Elmore City High School at the time, "I believe it was there to keep down the riots and drunken brawls, even though we didn't have any. It was an ordinance on the books that nobody paid attention to."

That's when members of the junior class, who were responsible for planning the school's annual "dance-free" banquet set out to change the outdated law, so they could 'kick off their Sunday shoes'.

"What made a lot of people against it was that it was preached from the pulpit. We just wanted to have a dance in a safe place," said Mary Ann Temple-Lee, member of that now revolutionary Class of 1981. "So we put together a plan to make it a win-win."

Junior class officer Leonard Coffee was one of two students upon whom Kevin Bacon's character was based; the other was class president Rex Kennedy (Rex + Len = "Ren"). Coffee remembers, "We were having planning meetings about the banquet, and I, not

knowing about the law against it, just asked, 'Why don't we have a prom like all the other schools?' We were told the school board was afraid things would get out of hand, so they were condemning us before we ever did anything wrong. A lot of folks told us we were wasting our time, that the board was never going to allow it."

The argument was without a proper prom, student would probably leave the banquet and head for neighboring towns to dance, as they had done in years past. A celebration at school that included dancing would keep them in town and would be a safer alternative.

The class officers asked Principal Worsham for help. He developed a presentation for the school board that respectfully showed the benefits of having a prom. Luckily, the City Council had already decided to defer to the school board on the matter, deeming prom to be more of a private matter than a public dance.

Said Temple-Lee, "In our minds, there was truly no doubt that we could do it. We were very professional and organized, and we were doing the right thing."

After the students finished their presentation, the board voted. It was a tie. That meant the decisioning vote would be cast by the school board president, Raymond Temple. He voted "yes" and his daughter Mary Ann finally got to 'cut loose' with her sweetheart, Leonard, at Elmore City High School's first annual prom.
