<u>Hospice Ministry Note</u>: Snack donations continued for both WS & HP Hospice Homes.

<u>September Mission Projects and Outreach—Members voted</u> <u>& approved the following:</u>

- \$45.03 of WOM funds for the Disaster Relief mission project led by Jean on Sept 13th with 7 WOM members participating.
 20 laundry bags and 57 lunch bags were decorated for onsite victims & workers & these will be distributed on-site by Baptists on Mission volunteers.
- Candy was purchased for the Appalachian Backpacks, but the cost is not yet available.
- Canned food for the Appalachian Backpacks was donated by church members during the month, and WOM funds will be used if there is a shortage to meet the number required.
- \$400 to purchase registry items for Comfort Cases, which
 provides backpacks for children entering foster care
 throughout the USA. The backpack is filled with things like
 baby bibs & wipes, a pair of PJ's/lounge pants, a fleece
 blanket, etc. just something for a child to call their own as
 they are uprooted from the only home environment they
 know & suddenly placed in foster care. A \$100 check was
 also sent to help with other organizational expenses.
- \$200 for Next Step Ministries urgent wish list. Lisa C shopped for this project & purchased 68 items totaling only \$200.10!
- Approved providing an appreciation home-cooked breakfast for the 65 staff members at Union Cross Elementary School & 9 WOM ladies participated. Thank you cards were also given to each school staff member. Expenses known to date are \$261.98. A big thank you to each lady who participated, as the project proved to be quite an undertaking for us.
- WOM meeting date is being changed from the 1st
 Wednesday of each month to the twenty-second or twentythird of the preceding month.

I know I have previously mentioned the Chinese Proverb meaning of "*Crisis*" but I feel it is still so true for WOM that I am going to emphasize it again this month. The word "Crisis" is the same word as "*Opportunity*". Perfect example of our WOM
