

<u>Hospice Ministry Note</u>: Snack donations were continued to be delivered to both WS & HP Hospice Homes.

#### December Mission Projects and Outreach

- \$282 was sent to WS Rescue Mission for 75 meals.
- Sent \$700 to Baptist Children's Home in Thomasville during their match dollar for dollar campaign, thus our \$700 donation became \$1,400.
- Sent \$325 to Samaritan's Purse for shipping costs for the many OCC shoeboxes we sent and thank you to a few others who also sent donations for shipping cost.

Four WOM members also traveled to Charlotte to volunteer at the Distribution Center for Samaritan's Purse OCC.

- Delivered many toys and other gifts to Glenn View Baptist Church for the Eastern Forsyth Toy Store. The toy store held on December 14<sup>th</sup> was a huge success. We had 107 families signed up to attend and toys were chosen for approximately 302 children. What a BLESSING! Also 7 UCBC WOM ladies volunteered at the toy store.
- A few WOM ladies "adopted" some nursing home residents by providing a Christmas gift to each one. Melissa and her mother also provided Christmas blessings bags for 2 other chosen residents without family support.

As we look back over the past year, we know WOM members were committed to helping many organizations/people with our mission projects.
