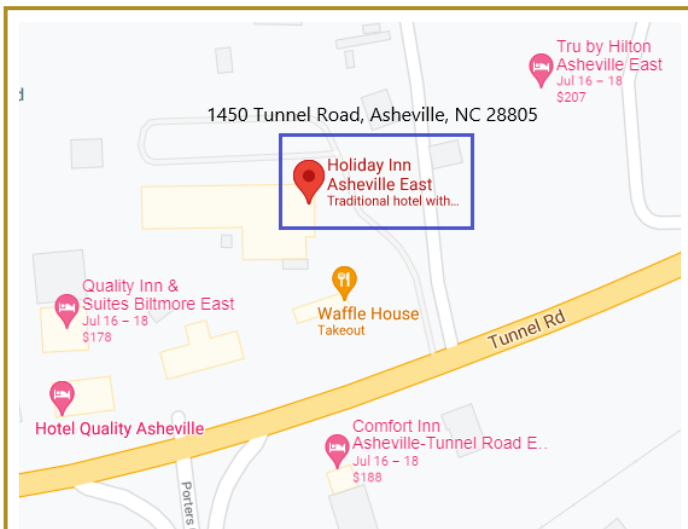
NALF SCHOLARSHIP
