#### Charitable Giving By Sir Knight William Crittenden PhD

With so many charities today and their increasing marketing sophistication and complex networks of activities it is extremely challenging to know which charities are most effective. As we enter the "Giving Season" those of you who donate to charitable organizations, other than the Catholic Church and Knights of Columbus assembly or council, might be interested in the following: http://www.monkeysee.com/play/27733-how-to-avoid-charity-scams

We have to use our heads and our hearts to see that charitable dollars are well spent on causes we care about. To help, there are various groups and charity evaluators that provide useful information. Three particularly good ones are Charity Navigator (<a href="www.charitynavigator.org">www.charitynavigator.org</a>), the Better Business Bureau (<a href="www.give.org">www.give.org</a>), and GuideStar (<a href="www.guidestar.org">www.guidestar.org</a>). You may have to register for services, but it is free & painless. Some also have a premium level service, but you would not need this unless conducting extensive work related research.

Charity Navigator <a href="www.charitynavigator.org">www.charitynavigator.org</a> is the largest charity evaluator and its website attracts more visitors than all other charity rating groups combined. The site features opinion pieces by experts and top-10 and bottom-10 lists, ranking efficient and inefficient organizations in a number of categories. The site is easily navigable by charity name, location or type of activity. The Better Business Bureau <a href="www.give.org">www.give.org</a> has developed a very nice site providing free reviews applying twenty accountability standards. Charities meeting their benchmarks are designated as a "BBB Accredited Charity." GuideStar <a href="www.guidestar.org">www.guidestar.org</a> includes records from almost 2 million nonprofits registered with the Internal Revenue Service. This includes each organization's Form 990, the basic I.R.S. filing document for nonprofits. Assemblies & Councils typically fill out the so-called EZ or postcard versions of this form.


# Web Site

# History of the Governor David I Walsh Assembly

#### Installment 3

At this point, claiming editorial privilege and confident of the acclamation of the Sir Knights of the assembly expresses gratitude to the State Chaplain for his appointment of Reverend Daniel A. McCabe, P.P., of St. Jude's Church in Waltham, as the Chaplain of Governor David I. Walsh, General Assembly. Fr. 'Dan', now Monsignor, has rarely missed a meeting of the Assembly and is held in the highest regard by the members of the Assembly.

Following the election of officers, mimeographed copies of tentative by-laws for the Assembly were distributed. It was pointed out, however, that the proposed by-laws would, of necessity, have to be submitted to the Supreme Master for review and approval and returned to the Assembly before they could become effective.

The attention of the Chair was called to recognize the presence in the hall of Sir Knight John Gallagher of Newton Council, a member of the Order for more than fifty years, a Past Grand Knight and Past Faithful Navigator with an illustrious record of knighthood. At this point, the Faithful Navigator invited Sir Knight John Gal-

lagher to conduct the closing prayer.

The meeting adjourned at 11:00 P.M.

On Sunday, January 25, 1953, the formal installation of officers was held at St. John's School Hall. The dinner which followed was presided over by Sir Knight, John H. Walsh; the principal speaker was the Honorable John E. Swift, Supreme Knight. The head table quests were the Most Reverend Eric F. McKenize, Auxiliary Bishop of Boston; Right Reverend Jeremiah F. Minihan, State Chaplain; Right Reverend William J. Daley, Dean Newton District; Willian J. Mulligan, Supreme Master of the Fourth Degree; Daniel J. Fitzgerald, State Deputy; Joseph Arena, Faithful Navigator of Chevrus Assembly; the Honorable Thomas Connelly, Judge, Brighton District court; and William T. Walsh, Jr., nephew of the late Governor David L Wa1sh.

At the meeting held September 22,1953, on a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that Third Degree members and their guests would be allowed to attend the communion breakfast. At this same meeting it was announced that the Color Guard of this Assembly

had been invited to lead the delegation of Fourth Degree Knights escorting Archbishop Cushing to his place of honor at the religious rally to be held at Fenway Park. Again, and at the same meeting, it was announced that the Color Guard had been invited to participate in the exemplification of the Fourth Degree at Worcester for the class to be known as the Bishop Wright Class. The Bishop was to take his Fourth Degree at this exemplification and be the principal speaker at the following dinner.

(Let me note here for inclusion where necessary, that the then Captain of the Color Corps was John Sullivan of Watertown Council. Captain Sullivan 1ed many rehearsals of the Color Corps at St. John's School Hall in order that they might perform in a manner both fitting and enhancing the many appearances of the Corps.)
