
Bishop Robert P. Reed

Pope Francis name Rev. Robert P. Reed and Very Reverend Mark O'Connell, JCD as Auxiliary Bishops of the Archdiocese of Boston. Cardinal Sean O'Malley ordained Bishops Reed and O'Connell to the episcopacy on the Feast of Saint Bartholomew on Wednesday, August 24, 2016 at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston.

Bishop Reed is of special interest to us since he is a member of Watertown Council #155 and our David I Walsh Assembly #403. He became a Knight in 2007 and a Fourth Degree member in 2008. Bishop Reed was ordained to the priesthood in 1985 and has had several parish assignments. He currently serves as President and CEO of

iCatholic Media and Cabinet Secretary for Catholic Media. Bishop Reed is also the author of Renewed: Ten Wavs to Rediscover the Saints, Embrace Your Gifts and Revive your Catholic Faith. Bishop Reed will become pastor of Good Shepherd Parish in Wayland effective September 21, 2016 and will assume the role of Regional Bishop for the West Region. A Knightly Profile By James Laurenza


Sir Knight Alphonse J. Frasso (PGK)

The Fourth Degree Emblem What it means...

The triad emblem of the Fourth Degree features the dove, the cross and the globe. The dove, hovering over the orb of the Earth (globe), is the classic symbol of the Holy Spirit and peace. Columbus' name in Italian (Colombo), also means "dove." Both the globe and dove are mounted on a variation of the Crusader's cross, which was found on the tunics and capes of the Crusading knights who battled to regain the Holy Land from the Muslims.

Spiritually, the sacred symbols on the emblem typify the union of the Three Divine Persons in one Godhead, the most Blessed Trinity:

The Globe—God the Father, Creator of the Universe.

The Cross—God the Son, Redeemer of Mankind.

The Dove—God the Holy Spirit, Sanctifier of Humanity.

The colors of the symbols are:

A blue globe with the land of the



Western Hemisphere in white.

A red cross with gold borders and gold knobs at the end of the points forming the ends of the arms of the cross, also known as the Isabella cross.

A white dove.

Red, white and blue are the colors of the flag of the country in which the

Knights originated. They are used to stress patriotism, the basic principle of the Fourth Degree.
