History of the Massachusetts Knights of Columbus

William J. O'Brien was born July 28, 1867 and died July 10, 1959. He was the 6th State Deputy and a charter member of the Robert Fulton Council #134 Dorchester. The council was instituted October 6, 1895. Robert was the Charter Grand Knight and served two terms (1895-1897). With the inauguration of the Fourth Degree on February 22, 1900, he went to New York City where he was inducted with other Massachusetts men.

Prior to his election as State Deputy on May 12, 1908, he served as State Secretary for 12 years (1897-1908). He also was a delegate for eight years to the Supreme Convention.

As State Deputy, the Order in Massachusetts grew from 130 councils and 19,033 members to 138 councils and 23,742 members. It was reported in 1909 that Massachusetts lead the Order in insurance membership, 11836 members out of 70,369 Order wide.

It was during Mr. O'Brien's term that Columbus Day was first celebrated as a civil holiday in Massachusetts.

Of the nine councils instituted during his term as State Deputy, Ausonia Council #1513 was very important. Apart from Teutonia Council \$225, it was only the second council not dominated by Catholics of Irish background.

When Mr. O'Brien died in his 92nd year, he was the oldest Past State Deputy and Past Grand Knight in the point of service in the entire Order.

Louis T. Watson was born October 25, 1863 and died November 19, 1942. He joined Brighton Council #121. Elected Grand Knight in 1899, he was appointed District Deputy for five terms (1903-1908) and State Secretary for four terms (1908-1912).

Louis was elected State Deputy May 14, 1912-1916, Four councils were instituted during his leadership as State Deputy, Cohasset #1676, Clinton #1701, South Hadley #1721 and Saugus #1829.

Membership grew from 23,742 in 1912 to 31,815 in 1916.

No Event within the State equals the Supreme Convention of 1913. Auxiliary

Bishop of Boston Joseph G. Anderson spoke of "the call to Knighthood".

Bishop Anderson struck a responsive chord amoung the Knights, when one recalls that on October 12, 1912 the Knights of Columbus of Lawrence Council helped turn the city away from violence when the International Workers of the World had stated a strike among textile workers.

The social question was not the only battle that faced the Knights of Columbus under Mr. Waters' tenure. It was the rise of the prejudice against the Order both locally and nationally. To combat this, the Order created a Commission on Religious Prejudice that existed from 1914-1917 with Past State Deputy Joseph C. Pelletier as one of this members.

Mr. Watson was a delegate to the Supreme Convention at least half a dozen times. He was Master of the Fourth Degree for 15 years (1918—1934). He also served the Massachusetts State Council as Executive Secretary from 1924-1939.
