Should Holy Water be removed from Fonts in Church during Lent?

Here is what my Pastor and Council Chaplain, Father Di-Perri told me: This practice is technically not illegal but is contrary to the Theology of Lent which is not just a season of penance but also a season rich in the symbolism of water and the washing away of sins.

Some parishes remove the holy water from the fonts during the season of Lent and not only leave it dry but replace it with sand, stones or even cacti to remind us of our Lenten Journey in the desert as we prepare to celebrate the joy of Easter.

# History of the Governor David I Walsh Assembly

Installment 2

At the meeting referred to above, Sir Knight John J. Harrington of Waltham Council was appointed to act as Secretary Pro Tem. The following are excerpts of the minutes of that meeting:

The meeting, pursuant to a call issued by the Master for the Massachusetts District of Cabot Province, was held in the hall of the school of St. John the Evangelist, on Watertown Street, Newton, on November 25, 1952.

The meeting was called to order at 8:35 P.M. by the Master John W. McDevitt.

The password was-taken up by District Deputy, Raymond Perry, assisted by Sir Knight Joseph Alarie of Watertown Council and Sir Knight James M. Purcell of Newton Council.

The opening prayer was offered by the Master.

The Worthy Master then read Section 26 of the Laws of the Fourth Degree, stating the purpose of the meeting and set forth, that it was pursuant to a notice to the members within the geographical area of the new Assembly.

The Master further announced:

That this Assembly was now in the being as the Governor David I Walsh General Assembly. The receipt of a gift to the. Assembly of a copy of David I. Walsh, Citizen - Patriot", autographed by Mary C. Walsh, sister of the late Senator, November 21, 1952 which, through the courtesy of Sir Knight John Sullivan of Watertown Council, was being presented to the Assembly by Judge Connelly of the Brighton District Court to whom the Faithful Scribe would send due and proper acknowledgement, and,

He had directed a preliminary or caucus meeting on November 19, 1952 as a prelude to this formal organizational meeting having no authority but merely to establish the ground work towards fruition in organization this evening.

The Worthy Master then announced that the chair was open to receive nominations for candidates for office in the various offices or positions of the Assembly.

The following were elected as the first or charter faithful officers of the Assembly duly constituted to serve for the ensuing year, terminating in June of 1953

Navigator Leo Gagnon Newton Admiral William Geegan Newton Captain James Sullivan Watertown Pilot Joseph Santuosuosso Cardinal O'Connell Comptroller John Murphy Waltham Brookline Purser Paul McGoldrick Scribe Daniel Carey Cardinal O'Connell Inside Sentinel Russell McMakin Lexington Outside Sentinel John Kerrigan Needham Trustee 1 year James O'Connor Wellesley Trustee 2 years John J. Harrington Waltham Trustee 3 years Edward Lloyd Cardinal O,Connell Upon a motion duly seconded, the ballots were destroyed.

The Worthy Master announced that there is an additional office, that. Of Faithful Friar, which, according to the custom and rules prevailing in this jurisdiction of the order, would be filled by appointment by the Friar of the State Jurisdiction and State Chaplain of the Order, Msgr. Jeremiah J. Minihan.
