#### History of the Massachusetts Knights of Columbus

#### **Installment 2**

At the age of 27, James F. Cavanagh, born June 19, 1872, was elected the third State Deputy on February 7, 1899. He was a charter member of Everett Council #97 which was instituted on June 22, 1894. As a district deputy from 1894-1899, he organized four new councils.

During his tenure as State Deputy, he was one of the few from Massachusetts to serve as a Supreme Director (1899-1900). At the time of his election on February 7, 1899, the membership was 10,331. By 1901, during his last year as State Deputy, the membership only grew by 176 members. As he completed his tenure as State Deputy, the number of chartered councils grew from 104 to 122.

Also, during his tenure, a Bay State council made history by organizing the first council west of the Mississippi . St. Louis Council #453 was instituted October 8, 1899. This honor goes to Mt. Pleasant Council #98.

The Fourth Degree was established as Bishop Cheverus Assembly. The Boston exemplification took place on May 8, 1900 and was held at Mechanics Hall. Five districts were established in the Bay State in the next two years.

When the state council was instituted, six district deputies were appointed and that number grew to 21 when Mr. Cavanagh assumed the position of State Deputy. By the

end of his term, in 1901, four more district deputies were added.
Mr. Cavanagh died September 18, 1949 at the age of 77.

At this time, two Massachusetts men played substantial roles in the growth of the Order throughout the United States. In the east, Thomas Harrison Cummings, a member of Bunker Hill Council, was responsible for organizing the Knights in Massachusetts and New York. In the west, it was James J. Gorman of Fall River Council #86 who had helped to spread the message of Columbianism from the Mississippi to the Pacific.
