The Christian confession of a triune God cannot be explained, it can only be believed. It is not a cop-out to proclaim that this belief is rooted in mystery. Mystery is the essential language and experience of belief. We lose something when we try to explain a mystery instead of embracing it. It may make us uncomfortable; it may provoke more questions than answers. Regardless, it does not suggest the weakness of mystery but rather the beauty, the wonder, and the awe.

Embracing belief and living as a person of faith is a singular journey. You cannot believe for someone else, and that person, even one you dearly love, cannot believe for you. It is also important to understand that as singular as the journey of faith may be, it ultimately ends in community. Dear Padre,

During Mass, is it proper for the faithful to raise our hands when pronouncing the words, "For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever"?

When the priest and people offer the Our Father together to God, the presider assumes an ancient posture of prayer, known as the *orans*—with arms extended and palms opened upward. After the Lord's Prayer, the priest keeps his hands extended and says alone the embolism ("Deliver us, Lord..."). At the end, he joins his hands, and the people acclaim, "For the kingdom..." This acclamation is meant to be the people's response to the embolism, and the priest remains silent for it. It would appear unnecessary for the faithful to now extend their hands during this acclamation—especially when it's a response to an embolism prayer that just called for the presider to have extended his own hands and now has them joined together.

Although the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* doesn't mention a specific congregational hand posture during this acclamation, it speaks in favor of "what serves the common spiritual good of the People of God, rather than private inclination or arbitrary choice," stating that a common bodily posture "is a sign of the unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the sacred Liturgy: it both expresses and fosters the intention and spiritual attitude of the participants" (*GIRM* 42). ●

A Biblical Walk Through the Mass

Twice a month before our weekend Masses, we have been given the opportunity to explore our Catholic Faith as explained in a video presentation. This experience is helping us to understand how the Catholic Church was started, how it has been evolving, that God has an undying love for us, and so much more. There are still many more episodes to help us continue our walk in our faith. However, we are going to take a brief break so we can look at the Mass and understand its meaning and why various Rites are performed.

Celebrating 165 Years of Our Parish Church

May 31, 1861 was an important date in our parish history. Our first church building was completed. The land was donated by Benjamin Curd. It was a log building and also served as a school. The faith of these pioneers began in the home of Charles Brooks Worland, Sr. in 1842. Missionaries would travel saying Mass and offering sacraments as they traveled the territory of Missouri.

Please give thanks for their faith and courage to build the kingdom of God here in Montgomery County.

SCHOOL PARENT FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS

- 1. Registration:** The registration fee is per student, per school year. If your child is removed and re-enrolled, a registration fee will be charged again.
Early: on or before May 31st - \$125
Regular: June 1st - July 31st - \$150
Late: on or after August 1st - \$175
- 2. Church Offering/Catholics Cost: Catholics** - Immaculate Conception School is a non-tuition school, because under the direction of the diocese, Bishop O'Donnell believes the education of the parish children is a mission of that parish. Therefore the children of the parish may attend the school because their parents are supporting the mission of the church by educating them (the child) in the ways of the faith. There is no tuition as long as the parents are **ACTIVE PARISHIONERS. An active parishioner is a person who registered in the parish, regularly participates in Mass and the Sacraments, participates in the community life of the parish, and TITHES faithfully and justly to the church.** We hope that you **WILL** tithe justly and faithfully as we educate the children of our parish while supporting the mission of the parish.
- 3. Non-Parishioner Cost: Non-Catholics** - \$4,100 for one child, \$5,450 for two children, and \$6,100 for three or more children.
- 4. Technology Fee:** \$50.00 per child with a max of \$150 per family for the school year.
- 5. Milk:** Milk for the school year will be charged at \$30 per child per semester or \$60 per child for the entire school year. Any extra milk will be \$0.35 per milk. **All** students are **required** to purchase milk unless a written doctor's note states otherwise.
- 6. Copy of Records:** Current Vaccination and copy of Birth Certificate for all new students, copy of Baptism and First Communion certificates for all new students or those recently baptized or communed. Copy of Divorce papers with custody statement for divorced parents.
- 7. Extended Care Fees:** \$12 for the first child, \$10 for each additional child- 6:30-7:15 AM and 3:35-5:30 PM, fees include before and /or after school (or any part thereof).
Example: 2 children = \$22 - 3 or more children = \$32.
 - \$17 per child on early out days, \$15 for each additional child:
Example: 2 children = \$32, 3 children = \$47
 - \$34.50 per child for a full day.
 - All Students: If your child is in our care after 5:30 PM, you will be charged \$1 for every minute after 5:30PM.
