**What Image of the Kingdom
Will You Serve Up?**

Jesus' favorite thing to talk about was a mystery he called the kingdom of God, referred to in the Gospel of Matthew as the kingdom of heaven. He was not the first to speak of it. The prophets before him spoke often of God's dream for the world. They wanted all to know what it would look like when God reigns here on earth as God already reigns in the heavens. But here added to that teaching by offering vivid new images of what God's reign is like. Matthew 13 is filled with such snapshots. The kingdom of heaven will be like a mustard seed, a pearl, a measure of leaven, a hidden treasure. It will be like a sower casting out seed, a wheat harvest, a net that catches many fish.

At the end of this litany, however, Jesus offers an image of what he expects of those who have received his teaching about the Kingdom. They are to be like "the head of a household who brings from his storeroom both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52). It sounds as if Jesus' disciples are to act like hosts of a banquet, setting the table with stories from across time to feed their guests with whatever words and images would best help them grasp the mystery of this kingdom. They are to continue Jesus' work of developing new ways to illumine a mystery that is in the end too great for words. ●

Dear Padre,

I'm in the OCIA program. My wife and I were married civilly. She goes to a non-denominational church but is not baptized. Someone said we would have to get our marriage "convalidated." Why? And what does that mean?

Convalidation is a legal term, but it can also be understood as good pastoral practice and even more as a wise spiritual choice. Basically, from a legal point of reference, your marriage took place outside of the canonical structure of the Church. It needs to be "regularized" and "documented" for you to move forward. Because your wife is not baptized, it cannot be a sacramental marriage, which requires baptism, but it can be made valid and recorded in official Church documentation. Such documentation is helpful, particularly if you have children and intend to raise them as Catholic. Also, if your wife ever decides to become a baptized Catholic, your marriage would automatically become a sacramental marriage when she is baptized. Nothing more is required of you. All in all, it is a good decision and a positive step in your spiritual journey. ●

2. Church Offering/Catholics Cost: Catholics – Immaculate Conception School is a non-tuition school, because under the direction of the diocese, Bishop O'Donnell believes the education of the parish children is a mission of that parish. There is no tuition as long as the parents are ACTIVE PARISH-IONERS. An active parishioner is a person who registered in the parish, regularly participates in Mass and the Sacraments, participates in the community life of the parish, and TITHES faithfully and justly to the church. We hope that you WILL tithe justly and faithfully as we educate the children of our parish while supporting the mission of the parish.	
3. Non-Parishioner Cost: Non-Catholics - \$4,100 for one child, \$5,450 for two children, and \$6,100 for three or more children.	
4. Technology Fee: \$50.00 per child with a max of \$150 per family for the school year.	
5. Milk: Milk for the school year will be charged at \$30 per child per semester or \$60 per child for the entire school year. Any extra milk will be \$0.35 per milk. All students are required to purchase milk unless a written doctor's note states otherwise.	
6. Copy of Records: Current Vaccination and copy of Birth Certificate for all new students, copy of Baptism and First Communion certificates for all new students or those recently baptized or communed. Copy of Divorce papers with custody statement for divorced parents.	
7. Extended Care Fees: \$12 for the first child, \$10 for each additional child– 6:30-7:15 AM and 3:35-5:30 PM, fees include before and /or after school (or any part thereof). Example: 2 children = \$22 – 3 or more children = \$32. • \$17 per child on early out days, \$15 for each additional child: Example: 2 children = \$32, 3 children = \$47 • \$34.50 per child for a full day. • All Students: If your child is in our care after 5:30 PM, you will be charged \$1 for every minute after 5:30PM.
