I really value this opportunity to share a few thoughts to motivate you all from the Gospel of Luke 19:28-44. This is a very important passage where triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem is mentioned. During that period, there was a messianic hope that He would save His people from the bondage of sin. The core value of this passage has been preached worldwide even today; especially on Palm Sunday before the Holy week starts. I would like to bring two thoughts before you...

It's Your Time:

Jesus asked His disciple, to go to a village to find a colt (young donkey) tied there, on which no one had ever ridden. Jesus told the disciple, loose the colt, and bring it here (Luke 19:30). Today many of us are waiting patiently and praying for God's plan to be fulfilled in our lives. Some of us feel rejected, broken, disappointed, distressed and so much more. No one has ever known of our strengths and potentials, and we are just like a colt tied and tucked within us thinking more on our weaknesses than our own strengths. It's our time for a triumphant King to enter into our hearts so that we may be set free from all bondages and be used for our master's purpose. Believe, it is your time. Amen!

You are Called to Glorify God:

The one who called us is faithful and He will qualify us even if we are not qualified. Psalm 118:22 says, "The stone the builders rejected has become the corner stone". When God has a specific plan and purpose for each one of our lives, He will break every chain to untie us. When Jesus sat on the colt (young donkey), people welcomed Him, offering their cloaks and tender palm leaves on the street for Him to walk on. What are we supposed to offer unto Him as He visits us today? We are to carry God's glory and grace to people around us obviously and God will truly honor us as He honored the colt, "haven't they offered their clothes on the colt"? Yes! We are honored when we honor God among people. It's clearly mentioned that clothes were on the young donkey to express their joy in praising God saying, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" (Luke:19:38)

When Jesus is with us He uses our abilities, He abides in us, recognizes us even in the world's crowd and calls our name to glorify His name. Dear all, let us praise and thank Him to say, He will have me as a channel of blessing.
