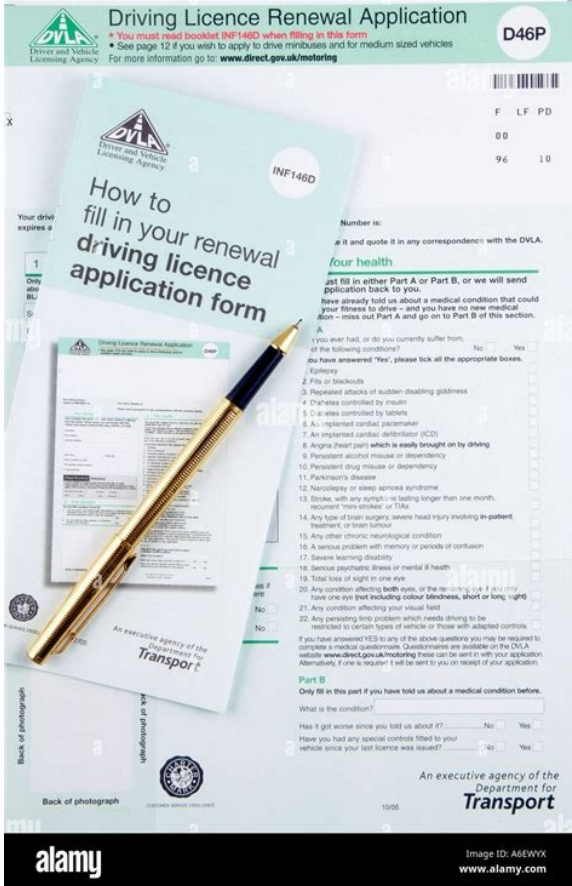

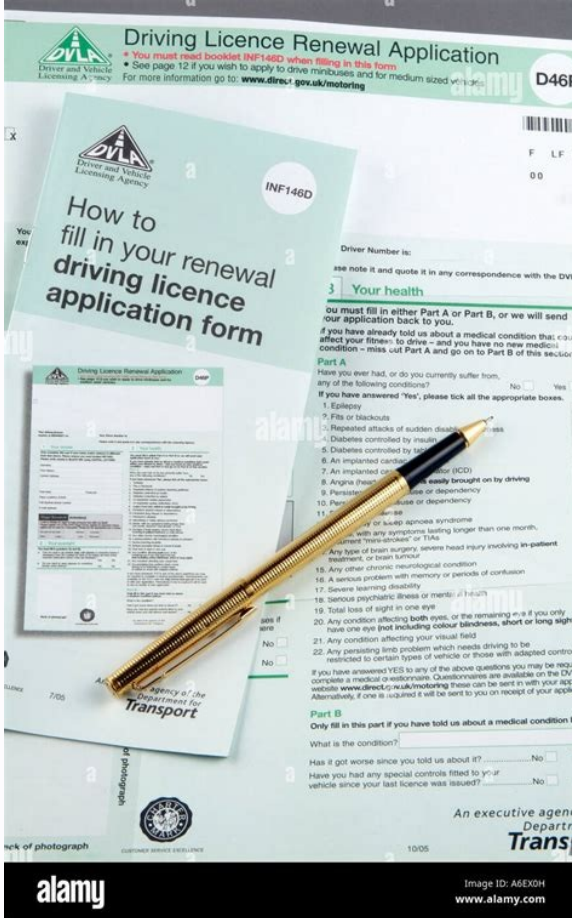

Extra Important Information You can renew your driving licence if you're 70 or over using the driver licensing online service. It is for renewing a British driving licence if you are 70 plus (or will be in the next 90 days) and: Your British licence has already expired (or will in the next ninety days). You meet the minimum driving eyesight rules. You are a resident of Great Britain (use a different service to renew your driving licence at 70 plus in Northern Ireland). There is no legal or criminal reason preventing you from driving a vehicle on public highways. Note: Once you reach the age of 70 years old, you must renew your driver's licence every three (3) years. You must use postal methods to renew a C1 (medium-sized vehicles) or D1 (minibuses) entitlement. Using the Driver Licensing Online Service The system will need some personal information from you to register a Government Gateway account. Hence, silver surfers will need to provide (all): A valid email address. Home addresses of where you lived for the previous three (3) years. Your National Insurance number (if you have one). DVLA will post some forms to a United Kingdom address. You cannot download some forms because they include features that do not print. For example, they may contain a clear plastic window to insert a photograph. Note: You can also pick up most DVLA forms from a Post Office.
