

## The Yew Tree Projects Group Update from Mike Blakeman

As reported in the last Yew to You the Management Committee are planning a series of improvements to the building. Funding for these improvements has been arranged from Key Fund Investments Limited who originally provided funding for the purchase of the building.


Following the completion of the disabled toilet and lobby at the side of The Yew Tree, a series of further projects have been proposed by the Management Committee. These consist of:

- Replacement of some of the existing windows
- Refurbishment of the existing toilets
- · Relaying the frontage paving
- Electric Vehicle charging points in the car park
- · Repointing of the stonework to the frontage
- Provision of a new kitchen prep room and storage areas in the outbuildings.

Work has been completed on lifting the paving to the entrance frontage cleaning the paviors and relaying on a new sub-base. The entrance steps have been rebuilt and now comply with current standards. The result is a massive improvement in the approach to the entrance to the Yew Tree.

An order has been placed for nine new replacement windows which will improve the insulation of the building and help to reduce heating costs.

Quotations have been obtained for the much-needed refurbishment of the toilets. Initially, the work will be focussed on the gents' toilet. The area of the gents is quite small and it has been a challenge to find a layout that will provide additional facilities. It is hoped that these works can be completed within the first quarter of this year. Further details of the proposed works can be found on the Society website.
