It was a beautiful early August morning for the interview and photos at Joe Calvet's home. When I arrived, Joe was busy dusting off the Chevy in his large garage. I could see the Model A straight ahead as well as several other vehicles, some with car covers on them.

I had previously noticed a very nice green, 1951 Chevrolet around town a few times and finally got to meet Joe Calvet, the owner at the Cannon Creek Shamrock Fly-in last March. I talked with him about his car and recommended joining our SRRAACA club. Joe said he had been thinking of joining so I signed him up. With his four years active and 22 years in the reserves, he was certainly eligible to

join AACA under the military program.

In late July, I contacted Joe about doing a feature story for the Oil Can. He agreed and we set an appointment for an interview and photos. Joe told me he also had a Model A Roadster and several other vehicles

As we all headed down to Gainesville to the Ford's Garage for lunch I had a good idea of what to expect after the article Ralph and Marie put in the Oil Can last month.




