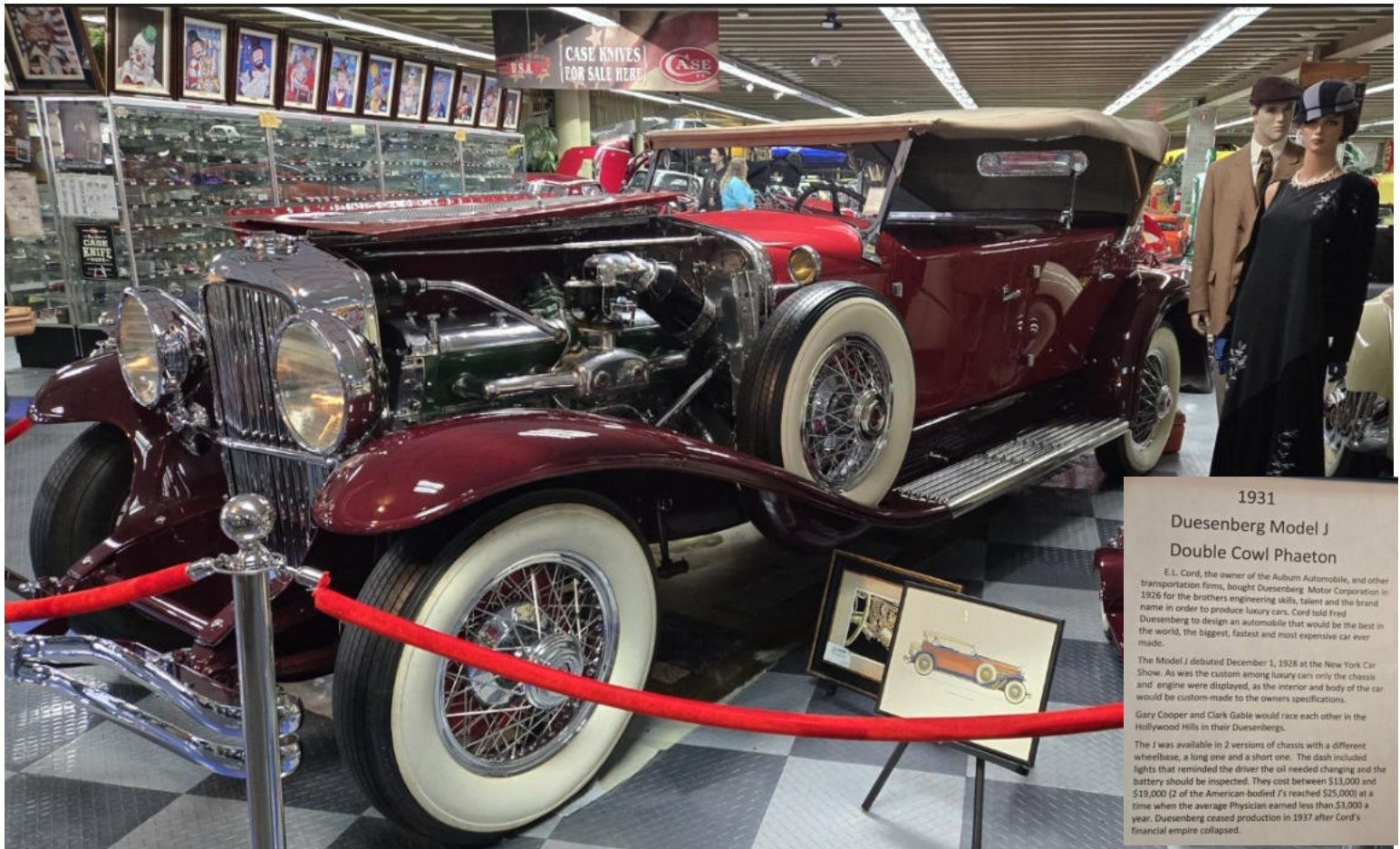

Duesenberg Model J
Double Cowl Phaeton
E.L. Cord, the owner of the Auburn Automobile, and other transportation firms, bought Duesenberg Motor Corporation in 1926 for the brothers engineering skills, talent and the brand name in order to produce luxury cars. Cord told Fred Duesenberg to design an automobile that would be the best in the world, the biggest, fastest and most expensive car ever made.
The Model J debuted December 1, 1926 at the New York Car Show. As was the custom among luxury cars only the chassis and engine were displayed, as the interior and body of the car would be custom-made to the owners specifications.
Gary Cooper and Clark Gable would race each other in the Hollywood Hills in their Duesenbergs.
The J was available in 2 versions of chassis with a different wheelbase, a long one and a short one. The dash included lights that reminded the driver the oil needed changing and the battery should be inspected. They cost between \$13,000 and \$19,000 (2 of the American-bodied J's reached \$25,000) at a time when the average Physician earned less than \$3,000 a year. Duesenberg ceased production in 1937 after Cord's financial empire collapsed.

Also on page 25, Bob Hoffman took a picture of the table at the "Cannon Creek and Friends" Christmas party that some members of our club attended. As you can see, it was a fruitful night with many raffle baskets on the table, some that were won by a few of us.

Kelly asked Don for the Website report. Don said there was nothing new to report.

Kelly mentioned that Shirley McManus has been updating the information on our Facebook page.

Before Kelly introduced Dave Holmes, who will be giving a presentation, Kelly talked about the January calendar of events. There are only a few things going on. January 20 is Sal's, which is every 3rd Tuesday, Hardees is every Friday night. Currently, this cruise-in starts at 4:30 and by 6:30 people leave.

February 2026 meeting

Kelly mentioned that Shirley McManus did not renew her local membership this year, so updates to our Facebook page will no longer be handled by her. We will talk some more about this later.

Kelly passed around the membership list so that everyone can look at their information to make sure it is correct. You can also add your car information to the list, if you desire. Ralph will email the list to everyone after he has updated it. SRRAACA has 46 memberships this year, down from 50 last year. Kelly thanked Doreen, Nina and Ralph for taking care of the membership information that needed to be sent to National by January 31 for insurance purposes.

Kelly recapped about how busy our fall was with the Cornbread Festival in Wellborn. We partnered with Wellborn Community center on that event, which was very well-attended. We held our annual Christmas party and gift exchange in December at the Wellborn Community Center.

Kelly then talked about our trip to the Tallahassee Auto Museum in January. There were 18 members that signed up to visit the museum. Chet Gray, his wife and son were in Tallahassee for a swim meet. After the meet, they came to the museum, so we actually had 21 in attendance. We had a good time.

Kelly again brought up our Facebook page and asked if someone would like to take that over. Suggestions were to copy and paste what Kelly sends out about upcoming events, post our club calendar, photos and captions of past events, etc. Shirley usually monitored the car events going on in the area. She would visit other online car club sites to get information. Layne Schultetus volunteered to take over our Facebook page.

Kelly talked about the ads. He stated that he would like at least 2 people to help him by visiting the businesses that currently have ads in our newsletter to see if they are renewing their ads. These ads help out our treasury. The ads are \$60 a year (for a business card size.) Ralph has already collected for three ads. Two were renewed and one was a new ad.

He said he took the speaker to see if he could get it fixed. They said that the module for the speaker was custom made for the machine. So they could not fix it. Many beautiful unique cars

1948 Tucker
Anticipated price - \$4,000

Only 51 Tucker's were ever made in 1948 due to financial difficulties, rumored to have been instigated by the larger automobile companies of the time.

This is Tucker #5 of the 47 that still exist. It can also be seen in the 1988 Francis Ford Coppola film, "Tucker: The Man and His Dream".

Truly a car ahead of its time. Standard features were pop-out safety glass, seat belts, a padded dashboard, a body structure specifically designed to protect occupants, separately locking parking brake, large protective bumpers, and interior knobs/controls which were rounded off to limit potential injury to occupants in a crash.

Engine: 335 ci / 150 hp / Flat 6-cylinder
Estimated Gas Mileage: 20 mpg
0 - 60 mph: 10 seconds



1950 Crosley Super Convertible
Base price - \$949

Powel Crosley Jr. started producing the Crosley automobile in 1939. Crosley had previously manufactured radios and refrigerators in the '20's and '30's. His plan was to build America's lowest-priced car. The automobiles were basically smaller in size and quite light in weight.

The first Crosleys were only available through large department stores and appliance retailers. This car could travel up to 90 mph and get 50 mpg.

The Crosley Super Sport was considered the first production model sports car to be built in the USA.

The production of the Crosley ended in 1952.

Engine: 46 ci / 748cc / 35 hp / CIBA Four

On a very cold winter morning, the club did a group outing on January 31st 2026 to the Tallahassee Auto Museum. It is located at I-10, exit 209A, which is only about 90 miles from Lake City. It was a quick hour and half trip each way. Some of us even saw some snow flurries on the way back.

There is a 1936 Bugatti that is black and "eggplant" (NOT purple.) The curator was very specific to call the color "eggplant." He said the owner would be offended if you called it purple. It is truly a one of a kind, original vehicle that the museum takes pride in owning. It sits right next to the muti-million dollar pianos section.

We have made this trip a few times over the years, and it is always enjoyable. Each time we visit, we see things we missed before, or new items that have been added. This museum contains some very unique collections (for an auto museum,) that are many and varied: Outboard motors, cash registers, pianos, dolls, guns, farm equipment, etc. The owner of the museum, Mr. Devoe Moore, has collected some amazing items of Americana; something for everyone. If you have never been, add it to your to do list. The 1931 Duesenberg, 1936 Bugatti, 1948 Tucker and 1934 Packard are incredible.

DEVVOE MOORE MOORE-STONE AWARD


DeVoe Moore's story reads like the iconic American dream. Born in humble conditions in North Carolina, his family moved to Tampa when he was 10 and he graduated from Chamberlain High. He came to Florida State to major in criminology with his sights set on becoming an FBI agent.

His keen entrepreneurial skills emerged early in his life as he learned to shoe horses during his freshman year and used the skill to pay for school at FSU. Two years later, he spotted another niche opportunity in the trucking industry and he was off and running. Nearly 50 years later, Mr. Moore's remarkable business skills have built a professional portfolio of national note.

Mr. Moore still rises at four every morning and works 70 to 80 hours a week. Most of his business is now conducted from his Tallahassee Auto Museum, which houses his collection of over 140 classic automobiles along with other pieces of Americana. Though one of the state's most successful businessmen, he never took a business class while attending FSU.

Mr. Moore and his wife Shirley, who met at FSU, have become one of the most generous donors in Florida State history. He and his family will have given over his lifetime 400 million dollars to the University and the Athletic Department to endow scholarships and help student-athletes.

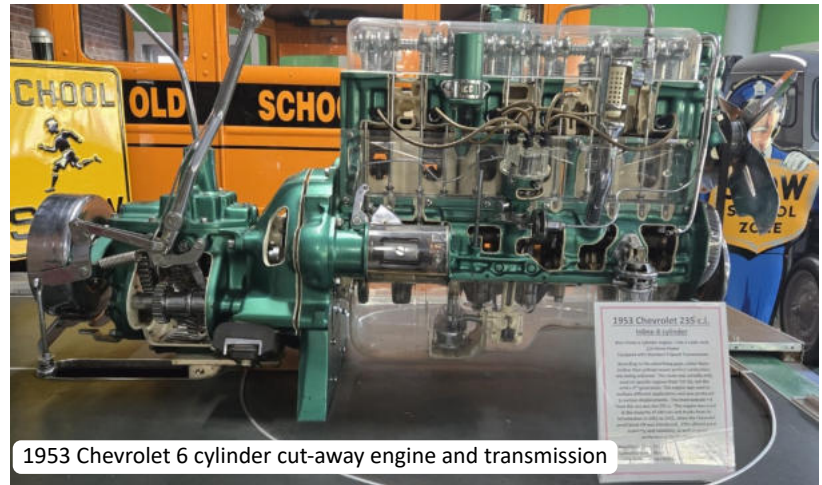
Mr. Moore has received many awards and honors over the years including an honorary Ph.D. and membership in the prestigious Circle of Gold. He is a member of the President's Club, the Seminole Boosters, the Miccos as well as a Phi Theta member. The University Center has been named in honor of DeVoe to commemorate his many contributions to the University.



A history of the owner - DeVoe Moore



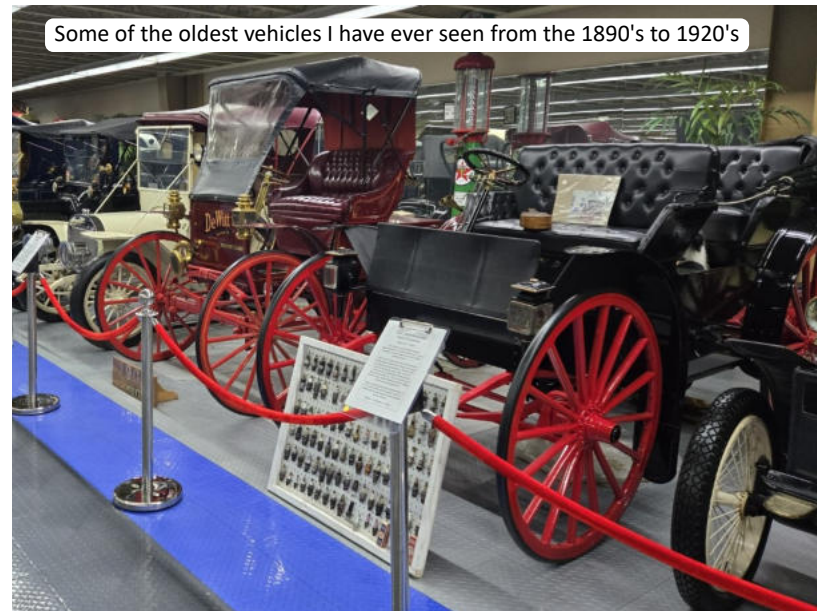

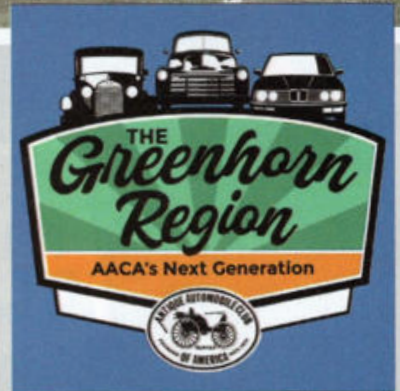
Greenhorn Region Celebrates 10th Anniversary at Hershey

Plans

Do your loved ones a huge favor

Coming to terms with our own mortality is a challenge, and that's what makes estate planning such an awkward subject. During the course of the past several months, I assisted with the disposition of various assets of several estates, so I thought it appropriate to revisit this topic with our membership-at-large. Each matter reinforced the importance of diligent estate planning. For AACA members, that usually means the transference of automobiles, collectibles, and other automotive-related valuables, such as literature collections.

Many of us have seen the havoc ensued after someone dies with an outdated will, or worse, without any directive at all. Family members are often pitted against each other, or at the very least, survivors are left without any idea as to the deceased's true wishes. Fixing this is not hard. Not fixing it may lead to automobiles going to a home that the deceased would not have intended or approved, or a lifetime collection of parts, literature, and memorabilia being tossed in the dumpster.

A recent exemplary case involved a hands-on restorer who owned two disassembled cars, parts stored in various locations, and a third car that was an unrestored original. His widow did not know how to deal with what had been left behind. I became concerned when interested parties tried to take advantage of her. Fortunately, I was able to survey everything and located a buyer willing to pay a fair price.

Another example was a widow with a rare vintage automotive sign that was worth thousands of dollars, but she had been offered only a small portion of its actual value. I advised her that the sign would command a much higher price at a high-quality auction, which, in fact, she did.

The last case was a deceased couple who had a very old will. There was no immediate family, and the executor was not knowledgeable about the couple's beloved antique automobile hobby. While the couple had intended to update their wills, and while both had talked with me extensively about a portion of their estate going to AACA, the executor acted unilaterally and sent a car to another organization.


Some of the most successful people whom it has been my good fortune to know have died with no will or advance directives. While no one wants to focus on their own mortality, preparing an all-encompassing will is one of the best things you can do for your family and loved ones. There are many ways to achieve your goals, including, for example, revocable, irrevocable, and legacy trusts. Professional estate planners can best advise you, based upon your desires. It is never too early, and we cannot be too young, to begin our estate planning.

Should you wish to include AACA in your final wishes, it is important that I take this opportunity to remind our membership that, while we display automobiles in the atrium of our national headquarters building, AACA is NOT a "museum." However, AACA is a 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable organization, so, should you generously choose to include AACA in your directives, for avoidance of doubt, the Club should be referred to as the "Antique Automobile Club of America," or if preferred, the "AACA Library & Research Center." If AACA is a part of your estate planning, we will be pleased to provide our Employer Identification Number (EIN) and other IRS information.

If you have a will, then please read it over carefully to confirm that it fits your present needs. If it does not, then update it. If you do not have a plan or other legal directive, for the sake of your family, have one prepared by competent legal counsel. During my 22-year tenure as chief administrator of our Club, I have heard too many heart-wrenching stories about inadequate estate planning.

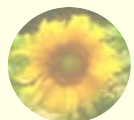
