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Hi Phil,

Thank you again for the additional information. I understand that the method of proposed upland vegetation management has changed since the initial application. Since the project is no longer proposing to remove stumps and roots, and the proposed new methods should not create significant ground disturbance, a DEQ 1200-CN permit is no longer required. The project will still require a CWS erosion control permit.

In addition to the information provided with this plan update could you please include the following:

1. Additional detail of the portable shredders, such as what is the general size, and will there be another vehicle transporting/towing it? If so, what kind of vehicle? How will the ground and natural overland hydrology be protected during transport through the narrow corridor along wetland?
2. Compost berm or straw waddles are both acceptable erosion control measures for this proposed activity. In addition to placing erosion control BMPs between the work areas and the Vegetated Corridor, please add measures in the areas where there is any potential for stormwater to leave the site. In particular, based on the topography, it appears that measures may be needed along the western boundary.

With this additional information I should be able to finish up the review.
