Child Development Credential



The Child Development Associate™ (CDA) National Credential represents the crossroad where education and experience meet. This crossroad epitomizes competence and is a pathway to learning best teaching practices for many early educators:

- A lead teacher who already holds an academic degree, but needs to gain hands-on practical skill and competency in early care and education.
- An assistant teacher with experience, but little formal education.
- A family child care provider who must improve the quality of his/her setting to meet accreditation requirements.
- A high school student interested in pursuing a career in working with young children.

The CDA helps early educators meet current state and national professional requirements. CDA recipients are competent practitioners who value vital knowledge and skills and formal education. The CDA is portable, recognized in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, U.S. territories, community colleges, school districts and the military.

Child Care Resource Center Policies for Online Trainings

Please read carefully to make sure you understand the expectations for our Zoom Trainings.

- CCRC ASAP Online Registration for each class will be closed 2 business days prior to the training. The deadline to receive a paper registration for a class will also be 2 business days prior to the training.
- Please be sure to provide your correct email address. If you do not, you will not receive the email for the Zoom training meeting registration, or the Zoom Confirmation email with the Meeting ID or other information related to the training. If you do not receive the Zoom registration link the day before the training, please contact CCRC staff.
- Two business days before the online training, you will receive an email with the Zoom Registration link and any other information pertaining to the class.. You must register in Zoom for each training. So that we can better plan, please register in Zoom by 12:00/noon on the day of the training.
- You may not enter a Zoom training more than 10 minutes after it begins. Please make sure in advance that you have the Zoom app on your tablet or phone or go to www.Zoom.us on your computer.
- Participants are expected to stay on the entire zoom training. Also, participants must be seen on the Zoom training. A box with your name is not sufficient for participation. If you do not have a webcam, please contact the trainer for accommodations.
- Please make sure you have allotted time for the Zoom training. Participants who are driving or attending to other matters while on the Zoom training will not receive a certificate.
- Please try to keep distractions at a minimum while on the Zoom training. We realize this is sometimes difficult but having other adults, children or pets present during the training can be distracting to other participants.
- Please test your connection at least 1 hour before the training is to begin. If you are unable to connect to Zoom, unable to hear the training, or
 experience other technical difficulties that prevent you from joining in the training, please contact staff associated with the training. The staff contact
 information will be listed in the Zoom Registration email.
- Before each Zoom training begins, the trainer will let you know if it is going to be recorded. If it is going to be recorded and you stay on the training, you are agreeing to be recorded. Any Zoom training that is recorded MAY be used in future online trainings by CCRC.
- Pre-assessments, post-assessments, and evaluations must all be completed in order to receive a certificate. Please allow 3-5 days for your certificate to arrive by email.





Description:


- 1. Place ice blocks on trays covered with several layers of newspaper.
- 2. Children sprinkle coarse salt on top of the ice blocks.
- 3. Children drip various colors of food coloring on top of the ice block.
- 4. Tunnels of color are created as the salt melts through the ice block.
- 5. Put the colorful ice blocks outside. If it's cold enough, they should stay frozen for several days. Children can continue to examine the melting process during outdoor play.


Fun Activity for School-age

Fun and Creativity

- Unstructured play is fun and promotes creativity
- This is especially true when using objects that can be moved, carried, combined, redesigned, lined up, and taken apart and put back together



Social Health and Team Work

- Unstructured play at recess is shown to strengthen problem solving and conflict resolution skills
- Outdoor play where children can explore independently can improve social health indicators



Mental and Emotional Health

- Unstructured play is importanto children's mental and emotional health
- Unstructured play can promote positive self-concept and self-esteem
- Active play can help decrease anxiety and depression



Physical Health and Gross Motor Skills

- Active, unstructured play helps reduce sedentary behaviours, promotes healthy weights and improves gross motor skills
- This reduces body fat, improves musculoskeletal and cardiovascular fitness which benefit physical health



Learning and Attention at School

 There is a reported association between unstructured play at recess and improved cognitive skills, such as attention, concentration and memory, as well as improved grades and standardized test scores



Resiliency and Risk Management Skills

- When children experience uncertainty in play they can develop emotional reactions, physical capabilities, coping skills and are better able to manage adversity
- These skills promote resilience and independence to thrive in adolescence and adulthood
