Big Changes Coming to Annual Health & Safety Online

October starts our new fiscal year and with every new year, comes new changes. Usually they are minor, but this one will have a bit more of an impact on everyone.

Starting this month, we will only offer the online version of Annual Health & Safety in 2 quarters: October / November / December and the April / May / June quarter. In between that time, we will have our usual Health & Safety Saturday classes in the spring. These are 2 in-person classes that get you all the CCDF hours you need. That takes place one Saturday in March, and one Saturday in April - annually. It's a great option if you prefer in-person classes and are from 8am-1:30pm. Also be on the look-out throughout the year in our training calendars as we will be sure to offer single health & safety classes year-round.

Please be mindful and plan accordingly when thinking about the year ahead and what is required. We are always here to help but there's not much we can do if you wait until the last minute. Every single teacher in the 5 counties we serve have to get these CCDF hours and unfortunately, we can't let an unlimited number of people take the class at once. Since it fills up quickly, we implemented a waiting list so that if we find any inactive participants, we can bring someone over from the wait list to have an opportunity to finish.

'Welcome to Child Care' and 'Pre-Service Health & Safety' will run year-round, but please know that these classes are specifically for people that are new to childcare and not a replacement for the Annual hours or the other required 12 hours. As of July 1st, a record has been kept of who has taken it and you will only be allowed to take it once.

The Child Development Associate ™ (CDA) National Credential represents the crossroad where education and experience meet. This crossroad epitomizes competence and is a pathway to learning best teaching practices for many early educators:

- A lead teacher who already holds an academic degree but needs to gain hands-on practical skills and competency in early care and education.
- An assistant teacher with experience, but little formal education.
- A family childcare provider who must improve the quality of his/her setting to meet accreditation requirements.
- A high school student interested in pursuing a career in working with young children.

The CDA helps early educators meet current state and national professional requirements. CDA recipients are competent practitioners who value vital knowledge and skills and formal education. The CDA is portable, recognized in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, U.S. territories, community colleges, school districts, and the military. Seasonal Activities

october Sensory Bin

Toddlers explore the October sensory bin by scooping, pouring, filling, and dumping fall-themed items. They can collect mini pumpkins in baskets, sort by color or size, and run their hands through the dried corn or leaves to feel different textures. Teachers can support language by modeling words such as "full/empty," "big/little," "soft/rough," and encourage social play by guiding children to share tools and play side by side.



Items to Include:

- · Dried corn kernel or rice dyed in fall colors
- Fabric leaves or real driedd leaves (Clean and Safe)
- Mini plastic pumpkin or gourds
- scoops, measuring cups, and small baskets or buckets
- Soft fall-theme toys (like plush bats or spiders for Halloween touch)





november aramatic play

Preschoolers can take turns being farmers, shoppers, or cashiers. They can "buy" and "sell" produce, bag groceries, and talk about their favorite foods for Thanksgiving or fall. Teachers can join in by asking questions like, "How much are the apples today?" or "Can you help me find three pumpkins?"

Set Up:

- Transform the dramatic play center into a fall farmer's market.
- Add baskets of pretend fruits and vegetables (pumpkins, apples, corn, squash).
- Include play money, a cash register, paper bags, and baskets for "shopping".
- Add fall props like flannel shirts, aprons, or straw hats for dress-up



December Build, a Neighborhood,

Children use blocks to build houses, towers, or stores, then add toy people and vehicles to create a pretend neighborhood. Teachers can encourage them to talk about where people live, where they shop, or where cars drive.

Materials:

- Wooden or foam blocks in various shapes and sizes
- Toy people, cars, and animals
- Cardboard pieces or felt squares for "roads and Yards"
- Pictures of houses, stores, and community building for inspiration

How our Online Classes Work

Online classes opens Wednesday, October 8th at 8 am and closes Wednesday, December 17th at midnight. This is a work-at-your-own-pace training and is available between the dates provided.

- · **Register on ASAP** you sign up for classes on ASAP but the classes themselves are on a completely different website. We will email you the link once you sign up on ASAP.
- · **Provide a Working Email Address** we will email you your login information, course details, and certificates.
- · Check your Spam Folder sometimes our emails go to spam or junk mail.
- \cdot 3-5 Business Days Everything is done manually by us. So we will sometimes need a few days to get you into the class and get certificates to you.
- **Paperwork** As usual, please be sure to do the paperwork to get your certificate: Demographics, Pre & Post Test, & Evaluation. We also check all work to make sure participation assignments are completed.
- · **Certificate** When you have finished a class, email the instructor to let them know so they can check your work and send you a certificate. Each instructor's email address will be listed under the last section of the class at the end.
- * It may take up to 3-5 business days for us to get you your certificate, but we will always put the correct day of completion on it.

Advanced	Most appropriate for professionals who have at least three (3) years of experience and 30 credit hours in child development. Advanced Level Training focuses on a more thorough knowledge and understanding of developmentally appropriate practice and highly effective application and demonstration of skills.
