## Care for Kids

You are invited to attend a training session to learn more information on the Care for Kids program! This program is a sexual abuse prevention program that promotes healthy relationships at an age-appropriate level for pre-K, Kindergarten, first, and second grade students. After attending the training, you will have the opportunity to schedule your time to have our staff work with you to facilitate the program at your center or family childcare home.

During this training, you will be able to explore The Care for Kids program which includes a classroom curriculum, trainings for center-based and family childcare home providers and school staff, and information and events for parents and caregivers. This workshop will be facilitated by a CCRC staff member who helped to develop the revised edition of Care for Kids, so bring your questions and curiosity!



Physical activity is extremely important for infants, toddlers, and preschool children. Not only does physical activity promote healthy bodies, it also helps children develop necessary school readiness skills!

PALS is a series of three trainings designed to give early care providers a solid knowledge base to increase daily physical activity in both indoor and outdoor settings. The PALS content addresses physical activity for children birth through age five years. The sessions will include topics on types of physical activity, how to build more movement into the childcare day, and how to encourage family involvement.

## **Child Development Credential**

The Child Development Associate™ (CDA) National Credential represents the crossroad where education and experience meet. This crossroad epitomizes competence and is a pathway to learning best teaching practices for many early educators:

- A lead teacher who already holds an academic degree, but needs to gain hands-on practical skill and competency in early care and education.
- An assistant teacher with experience, but little formal education.
- A family child care provider who must improve the quality of his/her setting to meet accreditation requirements.
- A high school student interested in pursuing a career in working with young children.

The CDA helps early educators meet current state and national professional requirements. CDA recipients are competent practitioners who value vital knowledge, skills and formal education. The CDA is portable, recognized in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, U.S. territories, community colleges, school districts and the military.




