Gardens

Here are some gardens to visit for your summer entertainment. Many gardens have art or music presentations as well as classes like floral design and painting. Hours are generally valid for April to October.

Bailey Arboretum-bailyarboretum.org

Locust Valley- The former estate of the Bailey family. Stroll the gardens, lawns, ponds and nature walks. Open Wednesday-Sunday 9 AM-5 PM. No admission, donations appreciated.

Bayard Cutting Arboretum - bayard cutting arboretum.org

Great River- Tuesday- Sunday 9:00 AM- 5:00 PM. The summer home of the Cutting family dates from 1886 and was designed by Frederic Law Olmsted. The 691- acre estate boasts a beautiful Tudor mansion. Stroll through Oak Park, the Woodland gardens, and the Pinetums and Conifer gardens. The seasonal gardens like the Rhododendron and Dahlia gardens are worth visits in the Spring and late Summer. Vast displays of blooming daffodils make early Spring special. Classes like flower arrangement, an herb and tea workshop, and yoga are offered. Grounds tours are on Saturday and Sunday at 10:30 AM. House tours are at 11:00 AM on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday \$15. Call to RSVP. Parking is \$8 and free to seniors on weekdays.

The Hidden Oak Café is open Tuesday-Sunday 11:00 PM-3:00 PM and offers a Victorian tea by reservation.

Bridgehampton- open everyday 10:00 AM- 3:00 PM- A five-acre gem in the heart of Bridgehampton, Bridge Gardens is a unique public and demonstration garden with undulating hedgerows, a wide variety of native and non-native perennials, annuals, shrubs and trees, an expansive demonstration vegetable garden, a large rose garden, and a unique 4-quadrant herb garden featuring culinary, medicinal, ornamental, and textile/dye plants. Clark Botanic Garden- clarkbotanic.org

Albertson-open every day 10:00 AM-6:00 PM- 12 acres donated by Grenville Clark to conduct the garden as a botanic garden and bird sanctuary, as distinguished from a park, and to fulfill its purpose of practicing horticulture and horticultural education. Clark Botanic Garden is now part of the Town's parks system. A wide variety of native and annual plant winners can be enjoyed in Rose and Rain and Display Gardens. Admission free. Garden shop.

Mill Neck- Saturdays 10 AM- 2 PM, Sundays 1:00 PM-5 PM. A 7 acre garden where Asian plants are collected in a Tea House Garden, Pond area, and paths with stone lanterns and stepping stones. Tea ceremonies, Shakuhachi Music, and Japanese tales and haiku are some of the available things to do. Admission \$7 or free? Tours are available

Landcraft Garden Foundation-landcraftgardenfoundation.org

Mattituck- Open Fridays and Saturdays 10AM-4pm. A garden begun in 1992 by two men who wanted to turn their 17 acres into a center for unusual plants and garden art with a beautiful house. Interesting plants can be purchased in the garden shop. Yoga classes and floral design are among the activities offered. Admission \$20/\$17 senior or student/ \$5 child. Tours are available.

Long House Reserve- longhouse.org

East Hampton-Open Wednesday to Sunday 12:30 PM- 5:00 PM- Long House Reserve is a 16-acre integrated environment in East Hampton, New York,

created by artist, collector and world-renowned textile designer and weaver Jack Lenor Larsen (1927-2020), serving the community with vast open space, programs in art, nature, and wellness, and providing a sanctuary for Long Island and beyond. Admission \$20/ Seniors (65+) and disabled \$10/children & military free. Private tours are available. Gift shop

Madoo Conservancy- mandoo.org

Sagaponack- Wednesdays through Saturdays- noon to 4:00 PM- The Madoo Conservancy is dedicated to the study, preservation, and enhancement of Madoo, the ever-changing, horticulturally diverse garden with historic structures established in 1967 by artist, gardener and writer Robert Dash. Classes, exhibitions, and lectures are offered. Reservations are not required, but encouraged. Admission free, donations appreciated.

Oyster Bay- open daily 9 AM-5 PM. The 409-acre estate of the Coe family was designed by the Olmsteds and is the home of Coe Hall, a 65 room Gold Coast mansion. The Main and Camelia green houses, the Italian Gardens are some of the areas ro visit. Self-guided tours of the Coe Hall are available for \$15/\$14 seniors(62+)/\$5 children. Group tours are available.

Old Westbury Gardens- oldwestburygardens.org

Old Westbury- open daily 10 AM-6: PM, closed Tuesday. Home of the Phipps Family and completed in 1906, the magnificent Charles II-style mansion is nestled amid 200 acres of formal gardens, landscaped grounds, woodlands, ponds and lakes. Westbury House is furnished with fine English antiques and decorative arts from the more than fifty years of the family's residence. Yoga, Tai Chi, a Rose Garden Walk, and an afternoon tea and garden stroll are some offered activities. Tickets \$18/seniors and students \$15/children \$8. Café in the Woods is open from 10 AM-5 PM

CSA - Community Supported Agriculture
