



An Update on Our Support for Rethabile in Lesotho

We are delighted to share that, thanks to your incredible generosity, we have raised **\$3,125** to cover Rethabile's college tuition in South Africa—enough to support her studies for the year. Your response demonstrates Salem's deep commitment to supporting young people, whether they are members of our own congregation or strangers living halfway around the world. Rethabile and her mother have both written heartfelt thank-you notes to express their gratitude. They are included below for you to read: Please pass this message to the good-hearted people at Salem church on my behalf.

When my daughter Rethabile was midway in high school, she spoke to me about her desire to work harder in her grades to prepare for the right graders so she could stand a chance to study either medicine/ forensics or others in the medical framework.

From then on I did my best to help pay for extra classes in Subjects where she felt she needed. She worked very hard right up until she finished high school and indeed she got the grades to qualify.

Now, we live in south Africa but are naturally from Lesotho. This meant getting scholarships was going to be impossible. The first year after high school she could not study all year as I could not afford to pay to further her studies. The second year I took on a sales /commission paying job so that I could work harder so she could go to school.

Life became very hard as she is not my only child but as a family we committed to be supportive to their future each in their own time. In March this year my department had complications and I was removed from commission earnings. Rethabile's dad, whom I am no longer married to, used to contribute here and there but now he is not able to due to layoffs in the factories in Lesotho

Things got worse than they already were, I had no idea what else I could do. I tried writing and publishing a book but that did not even take off. I then spoke to my brother, Abuti Pat [She's referencing Dr. Tšooane Molapo; Patrick is his middle name] and with much faith, fasting and prayers hear we are., completely unable to thank God enough for all of your sacrifices, efforts, time and prayers as well.

I can not tell you how grateful we are, she was at the verge of dropping out and giving up, also understanding that we tried.

Thank you for allowing God to use you to answer our prayers and being vessels in his hands so she will have a brighter future. God bless you all. May you never lack or want. Warmest regards Joalane Kutoane, Rethabile's mom
