Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. (John 14:5-6)

How do you know when you're on the right path? Often times, before driving, I check Google Maps to figure out how to get where I hope to be going. Even then though, without a good navigator beside me, sometimes I make a wrong turn and get delayed a little. If I'm lucky, my wrong turn opens my eyes to something new, like discovering a Whitey's or a Country Style that I hadn't seen before. Other times I'm not so lucky and end up late for an appointment. But in the end does it matter if any of us take a wrong turn or two (hundred-thousand) in our lives? Arguably not. No joke.

The turns in our lives can be many things; they can be major intersections that head us out in a completely new direction; they can be forks in the road where we need to think about which way to go; they can be roads that lead to dead ends and force us to retrace our steps or re-think about where it is that we are going. They can be exciting exploratory adventures . . . chances to see and experience something wonderfully unexpected.

And they can be always a reason or an opportunity to ask for God's guidance; to ask for the direction of God's Holy Spirit; to have faith that Jesus abides with you, in you, at every turn of the corner; and to have courage, knowing that even a wrong turn may provide good learning or experience.

This is trust. It is trust in the God who knows you intimately; sees all of your flaws and inability to follow directions. It is trust in an unknown, yet known, future. And this trust allows us to step out of our comfort zones, so that we can do the things that God is calling us to do.

We are embarking on a new thing or two right now. The RIM (Rock Island / Moline ELCA Congregations) are continuing to work together to discern how we might follow God's call to serve our communities together. Salem is beginning a journey of discernment called "Pathways" to help us clarify our path as a congregation, asking the question, "Where is God leading us next?" And sometimes doing a new thing can be a bit intimidating or even scary. Yet, it is important to remember that we are not alone on this journey, no more than we are alone when we go anywhere, even by ourselves.



Salem has an opportunity to make a meaningful difference in the life of a young woman named **Rethabile** (her name means "We are happy"), who is from Lesotho in southern Africa. She is studying Biomedicine at Endovos College in South Africa, with two years remaining in her program. Her annual tuition is approximately **\$3,000**, which her family had been able to cover until recently.

Rethabile's father lost his job in a garment factory after steep U.S. tariffs led to massive layoffs in Lesotho's textile industry. These tariffs have had a devastating effect on the country's export-dependent economy, leaving thousands unemployed and families struggling to meet basic needs.

Her situation was brought to our attention by a member here at Salem, and we hope to help cover **as much of her tuition as we are able** so she can finish her studies. Donations collected will be paid **directly to the school** to ensure they are used for tuition.

You may give a **one-time gift** or **monthly support** toward this cause. To donate:

- Place your gift in the offering plate with "Lesotho family" written on the envelope.
- Drop donations off in the church office.

On **Sunday, September 28th at 9:15 a.m.**, during coffee/fellowship time, **Dr. Tšooane Molapo**—cousin to Rethabile's mother, originally from Lesotho and now working at Augustana College—will join us to share about life in Lesotho, the economic challenges people there are facing, and answer questions.

Please prayerfully consider how you might support this effort to help Rethabile continue her education and bring hope to her family during a very difficult time.
