LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

Numbers 21:4b-9

'If anyone were bitten by a serpent, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.'

In those days: The people became impatient on the way. And the people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For

there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food.' Then the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. And the people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD and against you. Pray to the LORD, that he take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the LORD said to Moses, 'Make a fiery serpent and set it

on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live.' So Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on a pole. And if a serpent bit anyone, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.

Second Reading

Philippians 2:6-11

*'He humbled himself, therefore God
has highly exalted him.'*

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form
of God, did not count equality with God
a thing to be grasped, but emptied
himself, by taking the form of a servant,
being born in the likeness of men. And
being found in human form, he
humbled himself by becoming obedient
to the point of death, even death on a
cross. Therefore God has highly exalted
him and bestowed on him the name
that is above every name, so that at the
name of Jesus every knee should bow,
in heaven and on earth and under the
earth, and every tongue confess that
Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God
the Father.

Gospel Reading

John 3:13-17

'The Son of Man must be lifted up.'

At that time: Jesus said to Nicodemus,
'No one has ascended into heaven

except he who descended from heaven,
the Son of Man. And as Moses lifted up
the serpent in the wilderness, so must
the Son of Man be lifted up, that
whoever believes in him may have
eternal life. For God so loved the world,
that he gave his only begotten Son, that
whoever believes in him should not
perish but have eternal life. For God
did not send his Son into the world to
condemn the world, but in order that
the world might be saved through him.'
