

## Louisville Real Estate Report

Home sales in Greater Louisville declined in September while sale prices were up compared to a year ago. Total sales decreased 24% from 1545 in September 2022 to 1173 in September 2023. The average home sale price was \$305,360, up 2.4% from \$298,346 in September 2022.







## **Unmasking the Unknown**

# CREEPY CRAWLERS
