Meet the Illinois Prisoner Rights Coalition (ILPRC)



We are an **all volunteer** group of advocates, students, faith leaders, incarcerated and directly impacted members of our community. **We advocate for justice and transparency for people being mistreated and neglected while incarcerated in the state of Illinois.** As a coalition, we strive to bring together like minded individuals and organizations across the state, to ensure that incarcerated people have access to a well connected network of advocates. We believe that regardless of the crimes that someone has committed (or is accused of), all people have legal and human rights that deserve protection.

2022 Goals & Assessment: Program

- **Immediately** - establish a path of escalation when incarcerated people are not receiving the medical care they need
 - **DONE.** As much as we can without changes in legislation. There is essentially NO path of escalation or oversight of jails or prisons.
- **Short term** - shut down Iroquois County Jail
 - **IN PROGRESS.** It is a long, hard path to shut down a jail. While our efforts will not stop, we will also focus in other areas to make sure alternatives are present in addition of trying to shut down ICJ.
- **Long term** - we will establish alternatives to incarceration in Iroquois County
 - **IN PROGRESS.** Campaign successfully launched in 2022. Another death in Iroquois County Jail redirected some effort, but the throughline of this campaign in all of the work we have done has stayed consistent. While progress may be slow, this will continue to be our North Star.
- **Future Vision** - create a repeatable model for alternative justice
 - **DOWN THE ROAD.** We look forward to this day and this work.

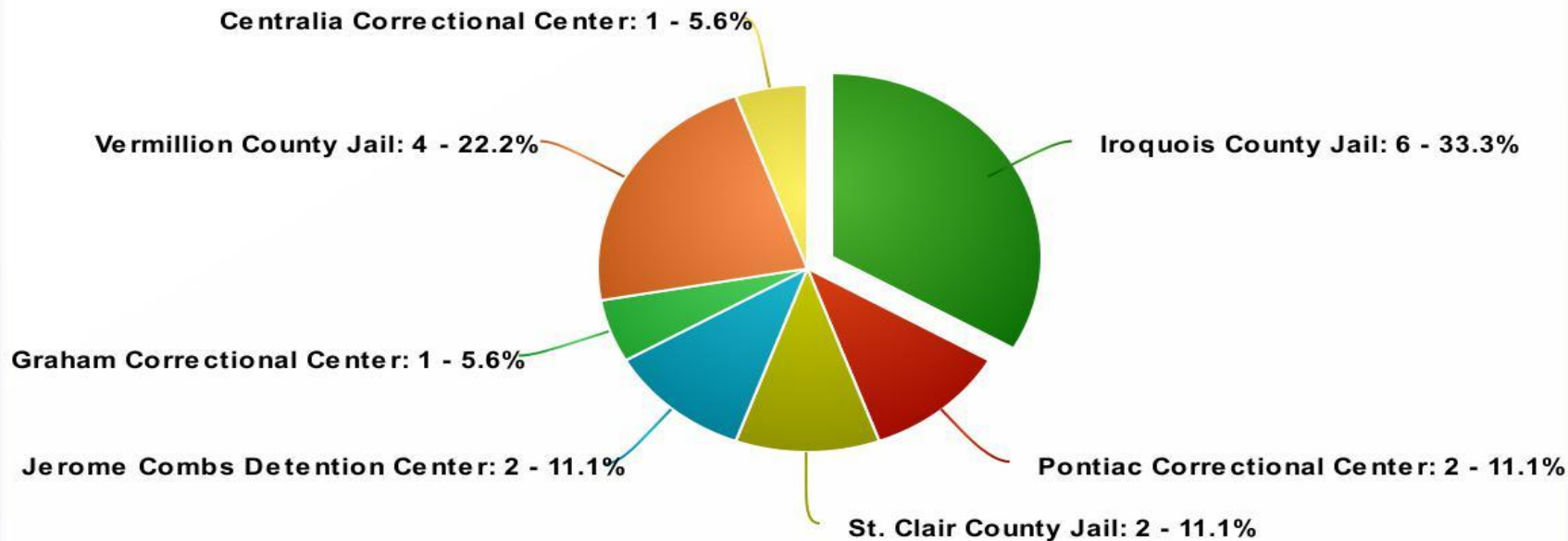
