

BYLAW 6/2025 A BYLAW TO ENACT A FIRE ADVISORY OR FIRE BAN

IN ACCORDANCE with Bylaw No. 6/2025 of the Rural Municipality of Paddockwood NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that effective 12 noon on June 19, 2025

And until further notice a:

Partial Fire Ban

Will be in effective for:

All of the Municipality of the RM of Paddockwood No 520

Anyone contravening this Fire Advisory / Fire Ban shall be subject to a fine in accordance with section 8 of Bylaw 6/2025.

This will be reviewed daily and unless otherwise notified will be deemed in effect.



Partial Fire Ban

Partial Ban means – No agricultural or commercial burning, no open burning, or fireworks are permitted. Use of Canadian Standards Association (CSA) and Underwriter Laboratories (UL) approved appliances are permitted (Incinerators, Liquid Fuel Barbecues, Camp Stoves). Burning barrels with screens under constant supervision are permitted. Campfires in approved containers as per Schedule A are permitted.

Open burning in the municipality is banned due to fire conditions in close proximity to the RM of Paddockwood, as well as inconsistent rains throughout the RM. Our proximity to the Northern Provincial Forest in well over half of the RM of Paddockwood leaves us more vulnerable to risks of large-scale fires. While we have had some precipitation it has not been consistent across the municipality, and dry conditions exist in the undergrowth in much of the RM. It is recommended that all individuals burning have water accessible at all times.

Schedule A

BYLAW 6/2025 A BYLAW TO ENACT A FIRE ADVISORY OR FIRE BAN

- 1) The fire appliance must be a minimum of 3 meters from all combustibles (ie: buildings, decks, fences, trees, etc.)
- 2) The pit must be constructed of stone, masonry or metal which includes manufactured fire pits and chimneys placed at ground level or above ground in a manner that will prevent fuel from falling out of the container. All openings must be clad with metal, mesh type screen with openings no greater than 12mm x 25mm.
- 3) All vegetation must be cleared around an appliance for a .5 meter (18") radius of the perimeter.
- 4) Only cured wood products may be burnt in the appliance
- 5) The appliance can be no larger than 1 meter in diameter.
- 6) No manufactured portable wood burning appliance shall be placed on a combustible surface or structure.
- 7) A source of water or a 2A10BC dry chemical fire extinguisher must be located within easy access on the property in lieu, a garden hose may be used if it is connected to a faucet and ready for immediate use.
- 8) All fire pits must be supervised by an adult registered owner or renter while operating.
- 9) It is recommended that the bottom of the fire pit contain approximately 25 cm of gravel or stone.
