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### **FOLLOW CDC TRAVEL SAFETY GUIDANCE**

If you're planning a trip, the CDC recommends you are up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines, including any boosters recommended for you. Be sure to check your destination's COVID-19 situation and any local safety protocol or restrictions before traveling. Wearing a mask over your nose and mouth is required in indoor areas of public transportation (including airplanes) and indoors in U.S. transportation hubs, including airports. Do not travel if you are sick, tested positive for COVID-19 and haven't ended isolation, had close contact with a person with COVID-19 and haven't ended quarantine, or are waiting for results of a COVID-19 test.

Contact the Employee Health Office before and after any international travel and/or if you are experiencing any symptoms or have had a known exposure to a person with COVID-19.

#### **MANDATORY SCREENING**

Screening is not only an essential part of keeping patients / colleagues / visitors as safe as possible and is closely aligned with our core value of integrity of being faithful to who we say we are. Screening is required by St. Joseph's Health as well as the Occupational Safety and Health Administration and the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. During the recent weeks, a lack of participation has been observed. Failure to comply with this regulation is unacceptable and put others at risk of contracting COVID-19 and other infectious diseases. Screening is standard operating procedure.

### **GASTROINTESTINAL COVERAGE**

Gastrointestinal (GI) service will be covered by Dr. Weissman (general GI and ERCP) through April 15. Dr. Szych (also general GI and ERCP) begins coverage April 16 and will be on through April 20. The GI physician on-call can be reached 7:00am — 7:00pm by calling ##585.

## **ANTIBIOTIC ADMINISTRATION IN COLITIS**

The Utilization Committee is requesting the medical staff to review these guidelines on antibiotic administration in colitis. Our goal is to reduce IV antibiotic prescribing when appropriate and safe. Multiple providers have had input developing the recommendations to standardize the care in the hopes of reducing antibiotic administration for simple colitis. Results will be shared in coming months.

## **CLINICAL DOCUMENTATION INTEGRITY**

Clinical Documentation Integrity (CDI) is embarking on a series of eight to twelve messages with tips to improve documentation and facilitate the accurate representation of a patient's clinical status that translates into coded data. The information will be distributed in this channel and <a href="here">here</a>.

### SEVERE SEPSIS

As per the original Surviving Sepsis Campaign, the definition of severe sepsis is infection with associated organ dysfunction. The definition of just sepsis is SIRS positive (2/4 values) and infection. The documentation of severe sepsis indicates increased severity of illness beyond just sepsis. While there are more recent guidelines which use the definition of severe sepsis for all sepsis, Medicare (CMS) still follows the original guideline as does New York State

If the CDI nurse sends you a query that states "Sepsis is documented in the chart. The following clinical indicators of organ dysfunction were also present.", we are looking for documentation of SEVERE SEPSIS. SEPSIS PLUS ORGAN DYSFUNCTION = SEVERE SEPSIS

The easiest way to avoid a query and to get documentation correct the first time is to use .ICD10SEPSIS to assist with your documentation.

### SHARPS DISPOSAL

Please do not dispose of sharps of any kind into the grey shred bins. Sharps should be disposed of in the red sharps containers ONLY. PHI (Personal Health Information) is the only thing that should go into a grey shred bin. If you accidentally put something in a shred bin that should not go in there, please contact your manager immediately, so that the contents can be safely retrieved.


