DESCRIPTION

City of Refuge Emergency Housing Program offers services for individuals experiencing homelessness, women that have been victimized by sexual exploitation and trafficking or abuse. The Residential Support Staff performs daily tasks in the home, provides direct client support during scheduled shifts, and maintains the standards and expectations of a safe, comfortable, and welcoming home environment.

The Residential Support Staff duties include daily cleaning tasks as assigned during shift, chore assistance and check, curfew check, medicine distribution, setting alarm, attending to emergency situations as necessary, and communicating relevant information through shift log.

- Attend monthly Residential Support Staff meetings
- Responsible for completion of daily tasks as assigned during your shift and by the Residential Support Manager including sweeping, mopping, house laundry, and maintaining a "visit ready" standard in the home
- Partner with residents in chores and upkeep of home
- Report any cleaning supply needs, household items, repairs, or other home concerns in a timely manner to the Residential Support Manager
- Assist in meal preparation, meal time, and cleanup in accordance with menu and schedule
- Clean and prepare room for new residents with welcome basket and other items as instructed
- Cultivating a welcoming, safe, and comfortable home environment
