Note To Parents and Guardians

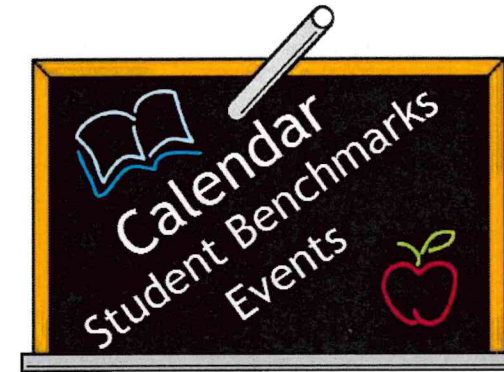
In the sacrament of baptism, we respond to God's grace with promises of faith on behalf of the baptized. These promises include:

- 1) To live with them among God's faithful people
- 2) To bring them to the Word of God and the Holy Supper
- 3) To teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments
- 4) To place in their hands the Holy Scriptures
- 5) To nurture them in faith and prayer

THESE PROMISES REMIND US how we are called to respond to the gift of God's grace poured out for us. Through Christian education and formation, we help our young people to grow in faith and to learn their identity rooted in their baptism, and their belovedness in God's sight. Christian education is one way we respond to these promises. Through worship, Bible study, service, conversation, and intentional tending of these baptismal promises and the gift of grace, we learn more about what it means to identify as Christian.

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT is critical to mature faith, love and discipleship development. What our children and teens see modeled greatly impacts what we are to accomplish, and what we promised at Baptism. Thus, **parents and guardians are encouraged** to know what is taking place and are asked to be actively engaged in their children's faith journey.

About the Curriculum...

We strive to provide all children at North Cape with a solid foundation in Biblical fluency. Our teaching centers on core stories of scripture and engages essential faith-development tools.

Our goal is to instill in young people a love and knowledge of scripture, so that their lives and understandings of their own stories and the world may be formed and influenced by God's story and God's gracious action. Christian formation ought to teach us who we are and who God calls us to be in the world.

4K through 2nd Grade

Each week, our Sunday School program focuses on the stories being read and preached in worship. Through songs, storytelling, crafts, and activities, the youngest members of our community get acquainted with God's Word in meaningful ways.

Throughout this process, we focus intentional energy on a few key areas alongside Biblical fluency:

Prayer

It is important for children to become comfortable with prayer, and we explore this topic through participatory activities with these young members of the Body of Christ. We practice the Lord's Prayer as well as the Table Prayer in an effort to instill an understanding of the power of prayer in daily life.

4 year old Students will receive a children's Bible on Sunday October 1, 2023 during regular worship services.

3rd through 6th Grade

Older elementary school students continue their exploration of the Bible through a books of the Bible curriculum. This curriculum is specifically geared to students in this age group. It focuses on engaging God's story and where it intersects with our own.

3rd grade Students will receive a Bible on Sunday, October 1st during worship.

4th grade Students will receive a Small Catechism on Sunday, October 1, through which they will explore Lutheran identity and curriculum.

5th Grade First Communion

Fifth grade students preparing for first communion, along with their parents will participate in a retreat (Date TBD). We will learn about communion, bake bread, and learn more about who God calls us to be at the communion table. First Communion will take place during worship on Maundy Thursday, March 28, 2024.

Acolyting - Grade 5 and Up

Fifth grade students (and any other older students who have not had training yet) will meet at 9am on September 17th for acolyte training. Please use the QR code in the hallway by the church office or the link on our church website to sign up to acolyte throughout the year. Students are expected to acolyte at least 4 times per year beginning in 5th grade. Contact Betsy Bauer with questions, refresher training sessions, and help with sign ups.

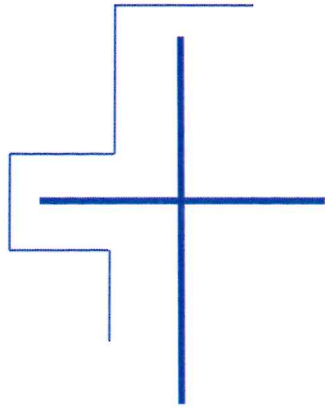
7th-12th grades

Part 2-Confirmation Program



CONFIRMATION DEFINED

"Confirmation is a pastoral and educational ministry of the church that helps the baptized...to Identify more deeply with the Christian Community and participate more fully in its mission." (ELCA - '93)

Confirmation is more formally referred to as "Affirmation of Baptism." Through the confirmation process, we learn and grow together, in anticipation of responding to the baptismal promises for ourselves.

Explanation & Information

Grades 7, 8, 9, 10

8th & 9th graders attend Mid Week Classes

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTABILITY

- A record will be kept to track each student's progress throughout the Confirmation program. This record will be maintained by the Youth and Family Director.
- The Pastor and Youth and Family Director will verify the fulfillment of class expectations.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Students are expected to worship regularly and attend all classes.

Students are required to:

- attend a minimum of twenty Sunday morning worship services and complete sermon notes. (online or in-person)
- attend five special services (Thanksgiving Eve, Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Lenten Services, and Holy Week) and complete the sermon notes.
- Attend fifteen Sunday School classes and nine of the midweek classes (confirmation).

When a student has to be absent from a class, the teacher is to be notified by a parent, and a make-up assignment will be provided.

What if I cannot afford the cost of a youth activity??

Please contact Pastor Robb or Angela Thomas if you are in need of financial assistance for a youth activity. Financial aid is available for all youth events.

What if I have a scheduling conflict??

If you are not available for class on Wednesdays or worship on Sundays, but wish to participate in the program, please contact Pastor Robb or Angela Thomas.

Mentor Program

What is a Mentor?

A mentor is an adult member of our church family, with whom a young person can build a caring relationship, rooted in their mutual identity as Children of God.

Purpose of a mentor relationship

- To build bridges between youth and adults as people of the Church who care about each other.
- To affirm with each other our faith in Jesus Christ and our faith in ourselves. We need adults who see things in youth that they cannot see for themselves and vice-versa.
- To encourage one another in love.
- To bear one another's burdens. (Galatians 6:2)
- To wrestle with questions of faith and life.

Suggested ways to develop a mentor relationship

- Go out to eat, fun activity, or service project
- Phone, email, text, or write a letter to each other
- Attend North Cape Lutheran Church youth activities together
- Conversations about home, school and the community
- Talk about questions and understandings of faith
- Learn one another's stories

How to choose a mentor

- If you or your parent/guardian already have an idea of who would make a good mentor, approach this person and invite them to be your mentor.
- Pastor Robb will supply each ninth grader with a list of adults who are willing to build mentoring relationships with young people. Check out the list and consider the following questions:
 1. Is this a family member? Pick someone else... ;)
 2. What am I hoping to learn?
 3. What am I willing to share?
 4. Do I have any sense of who this person is?

**If you are having a hard time choosing a mentor, contact Pastor Robb or Angela, and they will help you think about who might be a good fit.

What do my mentor and I do together?

Our mentor program will kick off with an orientation meeting on November 5th at 11:30am for ninth graders and continue into the following October (when they will be confirmed). Each module will be accompanied by a worksheet to guide the process and an evaluation form to report back.

The program has four components:

- **Getting Connected:** Our first module will be centered around learning more about one another and getting to know the passions, values, and life-shaping experiences of both parts of the mentor relationship. **This will be completed by Christmas 2023.**
- **Serving Together:** Our second module will be centered around serving others together. The mentor and mentee will identify an act of service they would like to do together and then engage in that experience and reflect on it together. **This will be completed by Easter 2024.**
- **Worshipping Together:** Our third module will be centered around worshipping together. The pair will identify a worshipping community they would like to visit (preferably not an ELCA congregation) and then go to either a Sunday worship opportunity or weekday worship service. They will reflect together about the experience. **This will be completed by the end of June 2024.**
- **Fun!:** This fourth module will have two components; both the mentor and mentee will choose an activity that they enjoy to share with the other person. This could be going to a favorite restaurant, doing a craft, playing a sport, etc. This will be discerned by the pair and will take place on two separate occasions. **This will be completed by October 2024.**

What are these new requirements?

- **10th Grade Retreat:** We will spend a day together growing in faith and learning about our baptismal promises, which will be affirmed at confirmation. (Date TBD)
- **10th Grade Class:** Tenth graders will meet for one class, to focus on Lutheran identity and work on preparation for confirmation (Date TBD)
- **Board Meeting:** Tenth graders are required to attend either the September (Sept. 12) or October (Oct. 10) board meeting and respond to a set of questions. Meetings begin at 6pm.
- **One Page Faith Statement and Verse:** Each tenth grader will choose a verse and write their own faith statement, reflecting on what it means to be a Christian and to claim this identity through confirmation. **Due October 22, 2023.**

All 10th Grade Requirements MUST be completed by Confirmation Sunday, October 29, 2023.

Purpose of Confirmation

To affirm the baptismal promises for oneself, and to work out what it means to respond to God's grace and wrestle with God for the rest of one's life.

- Each student will receive a gift from the congregation.
- Certificates are given upon completion of requirements.
