The council is committed to helping our congregation through this process, along with the committed assistance of the ELCA.

LWR Kits Needs

Your help is needed!! Looking ahead optimistically, and by the Grace of God, I am hoping to keep assembling the LWR Kits on "good" days during my cancer therapy this coming year. There are enough quality baby clothes and blankets already toted up.

- What is really needed is many, many bars of mild hand soap. Dollar Tree (3/\$1.25), Walmart (10/ \$4.97) or Menards (10/\$3.98) are some of the places I have found mild soap very reasonably priced. It does not need to be Dove.
- We also need large-tooth combs. I have found large tooth combs reasonably priced at Walmart and Dollar General as well as on Amazon.
- NEW dark hand and bath towels-not your luxury variety are needed. I have found great deals at Kohls using their sales, my % off promos, and Kohls cash.
- Diapers are needed for the baby care kits-flatfold or pre-fold diapers. Diapers can be made from flannel, approx. 22x27, then pinked around edges and zigzagged on the edges. They are also available on Amazon and Walmart for 10/\$14.99. If ordered online at Walmart, they are 10/\$12.84.

As always, any items are most welcome for this ministry for our far-away neighbors. I like to imagine that some of these kits may be going to our neighbors in the Ukraine. Please see complete instructions and supplies needed for the kits on the next page of this newsletter, on the LWR website, or in the binders on the Welcome Center. There are about 25 kits already assembled for this year's distribution.
