

Courage From the Interim Pastor's Desk... By Pastor Robb Kosky

Our Synod Assembly, for the Greater Milwaukee Synod of the ELCA, met on May 17th and 18th at the Italian Community Center in Milwaukee. Along with myself, Sue Gordon and Mark Wittenberg attended as the voting members from North Cape.

The theme for the assembly was Courage – one of our Synod's core values (along with Curiosity, Compassion, and Collaboration). In our devotionals, we were asked questions like, "What gives you courage?" and "What gives you hope for the future?" We watched a couple of videos of pastors and laypeople from our Synod being interviewed about what gives them courage in the face of injustices and prejudices they have faced, and how does the church help them and give them hope.

Their responses included things like the teaching of Jesus that we are to love one another. The examples of members of the church who stand up to help those in need. Being part of a community that proclaims and values the love God has for all people. The conviction that what we do as the church matters and makes a difference in the world. And even how witnessing injustice when it is done to others has inspired them to be more courageous on behalf of others.

Now, I don't know that I am a particularly courageous person. Across the board, I pretty much go in for avoiding conflict. When I think about my confirmation verse, Micah 6:8, where God tells us to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God," I've got the loving kindness and walking humbly parts down flat (I write with no small degree of pride). But when it comes to doing justice, calling out and naming the systemic evils in our world – well, I don't mind leaving that to others.

However, there is one event that, along with the teachings of Jesus and the collective witness of so many followers of Christ, has inspired courage in me. The event was the Unite the Right rally in Charlottesville, VA in the summer of 2017. You may remember that it was a gathering of white supremacists and various white nationalist groups united by anger, hatred, and racism. One woman was killed and many injured when someone drove his car into a crowd of counter-protesters.

What hit home for me after those events, is the conviction that what we do as the church really does matter, not only for us, but for our society and for the world. What we have, as followers of Jesus, is something that our world desperately needs. We have the teachings of Jesus – to love one another, to love our enemies, to pray for those who persecute us, to not insult or hold others in contempt, to

not throw the first stone, but to turn the other cheek, to not judge others but to treat others with mercy and forgiveness.

These are things that Jesus teaches us because these things do not come naturally to human beings. We are all caught up in the sin and pain of this world. We each carry our burdens, our scars, the pains and hurts that have been inflicted on us in our lives, and we all need to be acknowledged, loved, accepted, and forgiven. This, I believe, is the power, the mission, and the hope that we, as the church, have to offer to the world.

The political and social divisions in our country are a sign of the pain that all of us carry – our fears, our anxieties, our resentments, our griefs, our humiliations, our shames, our guilt, our anger. And in the face of all of this we have been given this gift – which we, in turn, can pass on to all those around us. It is the gift of the grace and love of Jesus.

And, I think, that we can live out this grace and love in kindness and in humility. And, I believe, that this grace and love is exactly what our world needs.

What we do as the church matters. We have what we, and our neighbors, and our community needs. We have Jesus.




Please contact the church office if you are interested in renting the pavilion for any special events in your life, such as baby showers, bridal

Endowment Fund Will Distribute \$4,600 in 2024

The Endowment committee approved a \$4,600 distribution from the North Cape Lutheran Endowment Fund. The distribution is based on 4% of the endowment fund value as of 12/31/23=\$113,052. The distribution will support church capital improvements and community outreach by our congregation, including:



- \$4,140 (90% of distribution): Designated towards the front step repair project o The 2023 distribution also designated a portion to the front step repair project, providing a total of \$7,830 towards complet ing the repairs.
- \$460 (10% of distribution): For a community outreach effort. If you have a recommended cause for this distribution, please contact an Endowment Committee member (Brian Lauer, Jason Gruettner, Nathan Leinweber, Carol Smith, Brenda Doberstein).

Your contribution to the Endowment Fund as charitable giving can help us make an even larger impact on our congregation for years to come!
