

- 1. Materials Needed: a Bible, a willingness to serve
- 2. Begin together with a warm up of "rose, bud and thorn."
 - a. Rose: Something great that stands out to you from your life recently.
 - b. Bud: Something you are looking forward to in the near future.
 - c. Thorn: Something hard that stands out to you from your life recently.

3. Read Matthew 25:31-40.

- a. When has someone served you?
- b. When have you served someone else?
- c. Is it hard to ask for help? Why or why not?
- d. Who does Jesus call us to serve?

4. Service Exercise

- a. You will choose an act of service you would like to work on together. This can be in our community, in a neighboring town or city, or with an organization one or both of you are acquainted with. Some ideas include:
 - i. Contact the Union Grove Area Foodbank or the Hunger Task Force in Milwaukee and offer help sorting donations.
 - ii. Work together to clean up litter alongside a main road in our community.
 - iii. Write letters to an elected official, advocating for a response to the needs Jesus describes in Matthew 25.
 - iv. Offer services to homebound individuals or persons with disabilities in our community who may need assistance.
 - v. Contact the Women's Resource Center and ask if they need any assistance with volunteer jobs.
 - vi. Contact Angela if you are in need of another idea.
- b. Upon completing your discipleship experience, respond to the following questions together. Complete the questionnaire on the back of this sheet.
 - i. What surprised you about your experience?
 - ii. How did Jesus' words from Matthew 25 play out in your act of service?
 - iii. Why is it important to respond to God's grace with action?

5. Pray together:
