

Worship: North Cape Lutheran Mentor Program

As Christians we belong to both our local congregation and our national church, but we also belong to "the holy catholic church" (ELW page 282) as well. The Body of Christ is vast, and has many "flavors," or denominations. Mentors and students are encouraged to attend worship in a different congregation and reflect on it together.

Ninety percent of churches in the United States have more than ninety percent of their members belonging to the same race. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said on Meet the Press, "It is appalling that the most segregated hour of Christian America is eleven o'clock on Sunday morning." How does this line up with Paul'steahcing, "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3)?

In this activity each mentor and student will attend worship at a different church or worshiping group (a Campus Ministry service will count). This is a great chance to connect with our broader Christian extended family, learn that wherever we are called there will be a Lutheran church nearby, and to experience worship with people of a different race or class than us.

Worship

Through all of the ages, worship has been a part of the Christian life. Sometimes it is a quiet time alone with God. This packet has four parts, three activities and an evaluation. Each has its own set of directions.

Activity #1-Experiencing Worship-You will attend one of the services available at NCLC. Activity #2-Together in Worship-Mentor and teen will attend worship at a different church.

Activity #3-**Reflecting on Worship-**Mentor and teen reflect on and discuss the worship experiences and worship in general.

Activity #4-Evaluation-This is the only portion of this packet that needs to be turned in.

- 4. Describe an experience outside of congregational worship in which you felt close to God. Where is it? What did you experience? How did you feel? Why was it special?
- 5. Imagine you are the parent of a son or daughter who comes to you and says, "I can't see any reason why I should have to go to worship services. None of my friends do and I'm not going to anymore either." What would you say to him or her? What would you do? What difference would it make if you were not regular in attendance yourself?
- 6. If you could change one thing about sermons, what would it be?
