## What Is Behind the Stories: Resurrection

From the Interim Pastor's Desk...

The biblical stories of Jesus' resurrection are a strange lot, full of angels, earthquakes, mistaken identities, fear, amazement, and perplexity. This isn't surprising, given that these stories reflect the disciples' memories of an extraordinary event which took place during a time of heightened emotions, and all the more so in that they were recorded decades after they took place.

#### At the Empty Tomb

All four gospel writers record the women going to the tomb early on the first day of the week, finding the stone rolled away from the entrance, and the body of Jesus gone. Matthew adds an earthquake and an angel as a means of moving the stone, whereas the others just leave the stone's removal as a mystery overshadowed by the missing body of Jesus.

After the discovery of the missing body, John shows Mary Magdalene running back to inform Peter and John of this disturbing discovery. The other Gospels include an explanation of what has happened given by either one or two men in dazzling robes or by the angel who had just moved the stone and sat upon it.

Luke (and John) tell us that Peter (and John) went to investigate, but they only manage to verify what they had already been told by the women.

#### Jesus Appears (or not)

Mark ended his Gospel at this point – the women are afraid and flee from the tomb – and that's it. (Some time later, a couple of other endings were added to Mark, in which the risen Jesus actually does show up. Apparently, Mark ended his Gospel on the principle of "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe" as Jesus says to Thomas in John's Gospel.)

Matthew, Luke, and John all tell us stories of the resurrected Jesus appearing to the disciples, but these are all quite different. Twice, Jesus shows up outside of the tomb – either to Mary Magdalene (in which she doesn't recognize him until he says her name) or to the women in general. Mark indicates that Jesus will meet the disciples back in Galilee and Matthew actually shows us such an appearance.

In another case of mistaken identity, Luke has two disciples walk for miles talking with Jesus and not recognizing him until they sit down to dinner and Jesus breaks and blesses the bread – at which point he disappears. At other times, Jesus shows up to the disciples in locked rooms and even fixes breakfast for them on the shore of the Sea of Galilee.

#### North Cape Lutheran Church April 8, 2025 6:30pm Church Library

**Attendees:** Pastor Robb Kosky, Les Gumieny, Mark Ehleiter, Maggie Techert, Kathy Paul, Linda Spencer, Amy Stillson, and Julie Kastenson.

Meeting called to order by President, Les Gumieny.

#### **Consent Agenda Approved**

#### **AV System Update**

We have contacted 3 companies. To date we have received 2 bids to update our AV system. One company, Metro Sound, is located locally in Mukwonago, WI. The second company is in Indianapolis, IN. The Indianapolis company's bid was substantially higher. Our AV system is comprised of multiple components. The price we pay depends on which components we replace. Some of our AV components need to be replaced more critically than others. Robbyn discussed the potential AV components to be replaced. Money, of course, will limit our AV expenditures. There ensued a discussion of the potential financial resources that could be used to pay for the AV system. We need 50% of the dollars before we sign a contract. If things go well, hopefully we could sign a contract in early fall. The Council advised Robbyn to definitize a specific proposal itemizing which AV items must be replaced and why plus their associated cost, and which AV items it would be prudent to replace and why, plus their associated cost. When the proposal is complete, it needs to be presented to Council for vote. It is also anticipated that if the Council votes to proceed with the proposal, a Congregational Meeting would need to be scheduled.

#### **Endowment Fund**

Stephanie Sorenson, representing the Endowment Fund, presented the 2024 and the prospective 2025 Endowment Fund Distributions. In 2024 the Endowment Fund made a distribution of \$4,600 with \$4,140 going towards the front steps and \$460 going towards outreach. In 2025 the prospective 4% distribution is \$4,847.76; rounded up to \$4,900. 90% of which is \$4,410 which would be given to upgrade the sound system and 10% of which is \$490 which would be given for outreach.

#### **Worship Update**

Holy week: We will process into the Church on Palm Sunday from either the narthex or outdoors depending on the weather. The Passion readings will take place on Palm Sunday and Maudy Thursday.

#### Introduce Treasurer

Julie Kastenson was introduced to the Council.

#### **Stewardship Updates**

The Stewardship Committee met in March and April, and will meet again on May 18th at 9:15am. They recommended making the Simply Giving form more readily available.

Intentional, planned, regular, and generous offerings will make all the difference for North Cape this year. According to our annual Ministry Plan, our expenses average nearly \$6,300 per week. Thank you.

#### **Doubt and Belief**

This strangeness and inconsistency of the stories have led people both to doubt and to believe in the resurrection of Jesus.

On the one hand, why did people who knew Jesus well not recognize him, and how could he simply appear in locked rooms? On the other hand, if the stories all agreed, it would seem like the 'witnesses' in a crime drama who are trying to get their story straight. The fact that there are so many different stories shows that there were many different traditions and memories of Jesus appearing to the disciples.

I don't think the resurrection of Jesus is simp- The motion was seconded and passed. ly about believing in it or not believing in it. Instead, it is about faith – "the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." (Heb 11:1) In Mark's Gospel, a father brings his son to Jesus to be healed and declares "I believe; help my unbelief!" (Mk 9:24), and in Matthew, when the resurrected Jesus appears to the disciples, we are told that "When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted." (Mt 28:17)

I believe in the resurrection of Jesus – that God raised Jesus from the dead and therefore that death has been conquered. I think that the stories are strange, and I have a lot of questions about those events and few answers. I have hope in God's love, mercy, forgiveness, and power, that God is active in our lives and that in death we will rest in the hands of God. I have faith, not a modern or scientific proof that precludes all questions and eliminates all doubts, but a trust in the God I have come to know through Jesus Christ.


