### Following Jesus in the 21st Century – Part 1 From the Interim Pastor's Desk... By Pastor Robb Kosky

### The Twelve

When Jesus called Peter, and Andrew, and James, and Matthew, and Phillip, and Judas, and Thomas, and the others of the 12, he called them to follow him, to be his disciples, to live and travel along side of him, and to learn from him a new way of living in the world. This new way had to do with loving not just your friends and family, but also your enemies, with turning the other cheek, with forgiving others as we have been forgiven by God, with feeding those who are hungry, with bringing healing to others, and with caring for the outcasts and the needy. Jesus taught his disciples to store up for themselves treasures in heaven rather than treasures on earth and to live our lives in the Kingdom of God, which is already "at hand," or present all around us.

The disciples were called to what Dietrich Bonhoeffer termed a "costly" discipleship. They gave up their businesses, their homes, their communities, and eventually even their lives for the sake of following Jesus.

### The Times Have Always Been A-Changin'

This makes for a stark contrast to the church in the United States in 2025. We, of course, cannot follow Jesus in the same way as the original 12 disciples did 2000 years ago, and we have inherited traditions and structures from medieval and reformation Europe as well as those that have grown up on our own soil in recent centuries. The buildup of these customs has led to a Christian life which tends to be more selfserving and anemic than the discipleship of the early church. It is a Christianity which has often become more focused on building up and serving our congregations than on making disciples of Jesus. This, I believe, has led to many of the challenges our congregations face today.

Now, I don't want to sound like I am blaming our congregations or our parents and grandparents or accusing them of not being better Christians. My point is that it is difficult to live as Christians in our world, and the challenges we face today are different from the challenges Christians faced 50 or 100 or 200 years ago. Consequently, our church cannot look or act the same way as the church did at those times anymore than we can follow Jesus the same way as the disciples of 2000 years ago.

So, where do we go from here? How are we called to live our Christian lives in our present time and place? What is Jesus calling us to and are we listening? More next month.

### North Cape Lutheran Church June 10, 2025 6:30pm Church Library

Meeting called to order by President, Les Gumieny.

**Consent Agenda and May Minutes Approved** 

### Memory Café—Cindy Welch

Cindy Welch is requesting permission to start a Memory Café at NCLC. It would be one meeting per month for approximately 2 hours. The strategy would be to provide a musical performer for the patients. Caregivers would meet with a volunteer to provide a respite for the caregivers. Lite snacks would be provided. ADRC provides the structure for the cafés. Yorkville United Methodist Church already has a Memory Café. This would give caregivers a choice of dates if there was a second Memory Café in the area. Council approved Cindy Welch's request and advised her to coordinate with Ann's church calendar.

### **AV System Update**

### Robbyn Wilks obtained a price from Metro Sound located in Mukwonago, WI to update multiple components of our AV system. She presented this at the June 8th Congregational Meeting. The voting results of the Congregational Meeting follow: The option to replace the AV/Sound equipment totaling \$85,796 passed. The option to purchase a second screen and projector for the north side of the sanctuary for an additional \$15,862 failed. The option to purchase a Confidence Monitor for the back of the church for an additional \$4,850 narrowly failed.

### Worship Update

A wedding ceremony will be held in the pavilion on June 21, 2025. The 9am June 22 worship service will be held in the pavilion. There will be another cook out and worship service in the pavilion July 12th and July 13th respectively. Informal Bible studies are being held after our Sunday service.

### **Community Cook Out**

45 people attended the June cookout. There will be another cookout in the pavilion July 12th from 5-8 pm. The August cookout will be hosted by the El Salvador committee, the date to be determined. September 6th will be the final cookout date. A committee will be organized to celebrate NCLC's 175th anniversary to coincide with that date. There will be no fish boil this year.

### Stewardship Update

The Stewardship committee will meet tomorrow (June 11th) at 6:30 pm.

### **Mission Trip**

The Mission trippers are leaving on Sunday, June 22nd, at 5 am. They will return the following Sunday. There is a paid spot available.

### Financials

General Fund Offerings YTD May 2025 are \$112,586. Compare that to General Fund Offerings YTD May 2024 of \$82,963. General Fund Expenses YTD May 2025 are \$112,570. Therefore, thru May 2025 our offerings exceed our expenses by \$16. Compare this to YTD May 2024 expenses of \$117,927 when May 2024 expenses exceeded our offerings by \$34,964. Our financials YTD thru May 2025 have improved. There was further discussion of the need to pay a portion our benevolence dollars and the bank statements.

### **WE Energies Easement**

NCLC is one of the properties on Raynor Avenue that WE Energies is requesting an easement to lay its pipeline. NCLC has until August 5, 2025 to respond. Jeff Willms has investigated the request and has recommended we sign it.

# Special Congregational Meeting Update

On Sunday, June 8, 2025, we held a Special Congregational Meeting after worship at 10:00am. We discussed the proposal to upgrade and replace our AV and Sound System.

Three votes were taken on the three options presented in this proposal. Option 1 passed overwhelmingly with a vote of 66-4. This means that the AV / Sound System replacement was approved up to \$85,796 in expenses. \$54,862.80 of the funds have been raised or promised toward the project. That leaves us with \$30,933.20 left to raise. If you are interested in helping with the fundraising, please consider giving an additional financial gift in your regular offerings designated to the AV/ Sound System project. (You can mark that on your envelope.) Option 2, to add an additional screen to the north side of the sanctuary, was rejected by a vote of 14-52. Note that not everyone voted for all options, so the vote totals vary. Option 3, to add a confidence monitor to the back of the church, was rejected by a one vote margin, 33-34. This is also an item that is not an urgent need, and it could be revisited as an option in the future due to the close vote and interest.

There was a lot of good discussion and suggestions that the committee will consider as the project moves forward. Robbyn Wilks anticipates the approved project may be completed this fall. Any questions? Contact Robbyn Wilks.




# Memory Café Coming Soon
