

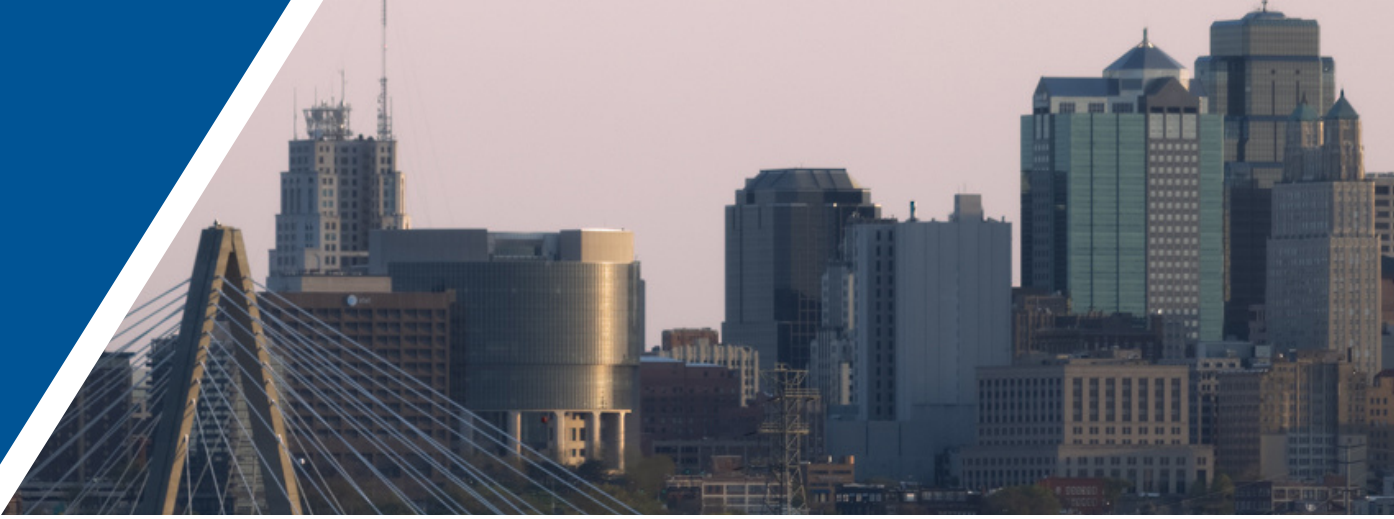

ABOUT FBCNKC

FBCNKC's story is one of steady faith and forward movement. Organized in 1916, the church gathered until 1918 in a simple room of the Commercial Building at Swift and Armour, now the site of the CVS Drug Store. From there, the congregation worshiped in a Chapel Car from 1919–1920 during the World War I era. By 1920 FBCNKC had grown enough to need a more permanent home. Its first building was at 22nd and Knox, and by 1928 the church moved to a new home at 22nd and Iron. This building continues to provide educational space on the north side of our facility. The journey of growth reached a major milestone on April 24, 1949, when the building that includes our current sanctuary was dedicated.



From our earliest days to the present, FBCNKC has been marked by a forward-looking faith, and that same spirit continues today. We continue to support SBC church plants through prayer and financial support. We continue to walk with our community through outreach, mercy ministry, and evangelism. And we continue to pursue the mission of reaching the lost for Jesus - at home, across the nation, and around the world.

RESIDENCY SNAPSHOT

The Pastoral Residency Program is designed to help seminary students *develop wisdom in the application of knowledge*. The program provides an immersive ministry training pathway that combines mentoring, ministry practice, and spiritual formation. Residents learn by serving - supported by pastors, shaped by Scripture, and strengthened through community. Here are some of the program highlights:

- Hands-on ministry experience including preaching, pastoral visitation, church administration, ordinances and ceremonies, and committee work through assignment as an adjunct staff liaison.
- Structured, flexible ministry rhythm requiring a minimum of 8 hours per week (32 hours monthly) of agreed-upon ministry work tailored to the Resident's season of life and seminary schedule.
- Church-wide integration and leadership development through worship and small group participation.
- Intentional mentorship with regular mentoring and coaching meetings.
- Clear finish line and recognition with a certificate of completion, including a potential pathway to ordination, based on the recommendation of a pastoral ordination council.
- Housing provided free of charge for the duration of residency enrollment.
- Clearly defined expectations and accountability.

RESIDENT HOUSING

The FBCNK Pastoral Residency program offers rent free housing options to residents and their families. The Crowley House is expected to be fully renovated in 2026, with the Bellman House completed by years in 2027.

PROGRAM DETAILS

Benefits

Housing: 12-24 months' rent free residence in one of the homes owned by First Baptist North Kansas City.

- A one-year Pastoral Residence with housing is estimated to have a real market dollar value of \$15,000 – \$21,6 per annum as of 2026. Assuming the minimum annual Structured Work Requirements (416 hours), this equates to a rate of in-kind remuneration equal to \$36.06/hour to \$51.92/hour. Accordingly, Pastoral Residents are expected to fulfill their responsibilities with an appropriate sense of professional responsibility.
- Residents must accept the lodging as a condition of enrollment in the program.

Practical ministry experience, including, but not limited to:

- At least four preaching opportunities per year.
- Pastoral Visitation (home, hospital, and visitor)
- Church administration, including committee liaison work, introduction to budget development, meeting moderation.
- Administration of the Lord's Supper (if ordained).
- Tailored ministry experience opportunities as agreed to between residents and FBCNKC

Pastoral Ordination Pathway

- Subject to the recommendation of a pastoral ordination council to be convened no earlier than the end of the last quarter of the residency.

Certification of Completion

- At the end of the residency, the candidate will receive a certificate of completion and honorarium (subject to approval by the pastoral staff in consultation with the FBCNKC Generosity Committee).

Responsibilities

Regular church attendance & Small Group involvement

Defined as 75% of Sundays over the course of the residency, and 75% of Spring and Fall semester weeks over the course of the residency.

Structured Work Requirements

- A minimum of 8 hours of ministry work per week or 32 hours monthly.
- Structured Work Requirement will be mutually agreed to, taking into account the applicant's other life obligations and expectations included in the proposed syllabus.
- Structured Ministry Work requirements may be fulfilled by any of the following:
 - Pastoral visitation (Congregant, Visitor, Hospital, Hospice, etc.)
 - Attendance at Pastors' meetings
 - Committee meetings
 - Ministry Event Support
 - Other ministry work as mutually agreed to, including but not limited to small group leadership, outreach, event organization, etc.

Monthly Work Requirements Disclosure

Residents are required to submit a monthly report summarizing how they have fulfilled residency requirements.

Program Exit Reflection Paper

- At the completion of the program, residents are expected to complete a 5-10 page single spaced reflection paper incorporating scripture, experiences as a resident, impact of reading assignments, and program impact on vocational identity.
- Reflection papers must be submitted no later than the first day of the last month of their residency and must utilize SBL formatting requirements.

Admission Requirements

- A public profession of orthodox, protestant, baptistic faith.
- Believer's Baptism.
- A call to pastoral ministry.
- Enrollment in a seminary that has adopted a doctrinal statement consistent with historical Southern Baptist faith, polity, and practice, or graduation from such a seminary within the last six months
- Applicants must enter into a lease agreement for the term of the residency.
- A successful in-person entrance interview with the Teaching Pastor, or equivalent, or with all Pastors.
- Completed application with proposed syllabus and reference letters.

Patrick Morrow

Teaching Pastor

Patrick Morrow came to saving faith in Jesus and was baptized in 1986. He has been married to his wife, Amy, for 25 years, and they have two daughters, Caitlin Hendrix (24) and Rhiannon Morrow (20).
