2. <u>NEEDS STATEMENT FOOD DISTRIBUTION.</u>

The existence of vulnerable persons needing nutrition and care of varying disposition In greater Johannesburg was identified by the <u>City Council of Johannesburg</u> more than 60 years ago as an urban challenge which needed to be dealt with and this is an ongoing challenge today.

3. MISSION STATEMENT

Our Organisation feeds vulnerable persons as a basic human need, thereby opening the door to further aspects of care and Social Development.

4. SHORT HISTORY

The <u>City Council of Johannesburg</u> approached The Congregational Church in Braamfontein in August 1961 with a request to distribute food parcels to the



elderly and needy living in the community and transferred **The Food Distribution Project** to a **Charity** then registered for this purpose. Our Organisation is the oldest of its kind in Johannesburg. Meals Johannesburg Food Distribution Services was established in 1961 in Yeoville, Johannesburg.

We are an established registered NPO which recognises and acknowledges the impact and negatives surrounding unemployment, homelessness, and poverty in our community.



We redistribute, repurpose, and divert surplus food into healthy cooked meals to our four main focus groups discussed in more detail below.

With 100 000 meals per annum received by pensioners, disabled and indigent people, the chronically ill and vulnerable children, Homeless, unemployed, and otherwise displaced persons.



5. HOW IS MEALS ON WHEELS JHB FOOD DISTRIBUTION SERVICES MAKING A DIFFERENCE?

Cooked Meals, food parcels and daily notorious soup (with bread) are prepared on our premises daily. An organised schedule of Volunteers delivers meals and non-perishables to The Centre, for onward distribution to our beneficiaries.

FOOD DONATIONS from numerous sources help tremendously in reducing costs. In this **FOOD DISTRIBUTION** process.

Meals are provided five days a week except for December when the Centre closes for three weeks over Christmas and New Year.





Over public holidays, double meals are prepared and distributed ensure that our beneficiaries receive food over these days.

6. HOW MEALS ARE DISTRIBUTED AND TO WHOM

a) Group 1 VULNERABLE CHILDREN.

Vulnerable children receive daily care and support five days per week at the Centre.









b) Group 2

ELDERLY PENSIONERS, DISABLED AND INDIGENT PERSONS.

Elderly pensioners, disabled and indigent persons have meals delivered by our dedicated team of volunteers.

Volunteers travel to beneficiaries' homes to deliver meals and provide care.







c) Group 3

CHRONICALLY ILL PATIENTS.

Chronically ill patients come to the Facility to receive a daily meal and support. Nutrition being essential to their wellness.

d) Group 4

HOMELESS, UNEMPLOYED OR OTHERWISE DISPLACED

The Soup Kitchen is their Primary source of nourishment from the youngest to the oldest. Recipients come to the Centre five days a week and others to the Hunter Street distribution point once weekly. Robust in-kind donations enable Meals Johannesburg Food Dist. Services to provide extra nutrition such as bread and a variety of items as available including soap and personal items required for hygiene.

Food parcels are distributed to otherwise displaced persons and families due to a number of social challenges we have experienced in recent years such as lockdown pandemics and social unrest.



7. OVERALL AIM OF THE PROJECT

We ensure care and nutrition is delivered to all vulnerable persons where possible and Help to develop Communities that are self-supporting. Our current Recipient base approximates 502 in total a schedule analysing of these statistics is included.
